
AHRAIN'S latest celebrity chef, Michelin-starred Chef Giancarlo Perbellini touched down in the kingdom as preparations were being put in place to transform one of the kingdom's oldest Italian dining destinations into one of his international signature restaurants.

The Gulf Hotel Bahrain Convention Centre & Spa's La Pergola will be rebranded as La Pergola by Perbellini following a redesign and extensive refurbishment. It is being carried out following high level talks and an agreement with the culinary master's architect and likely to cost more than BD200,000.

Chef Giancarlo has already appointed two leading members of his existing team to work the kitchens in Bahrain, alongside another senior chef from Italy, and he will be alongside them for the opening in late summer.

"It's very exciting times, he told GulfWeekly in an exclusive interview. "The reason we are here is because we must look at the layout of the restaurant and the kitchen and speak about the Italian chefs we are bringing in. We need to decide on

Xbe (pronounced Perbe) is Perbellini's brand, his 'corporate' logo and it is also the nickname that friends have always given him. It is on his uniforms at all official events, bringing his way of understanding cuisine and of doing business both within and outside the national boundaries

He told GulfWeekly that the new design of La Pergola by Perbellini will be inspired by his outlet Al Capitan, a winning vibe that will also be mirrored at his new restaurant in Milan which opens at the end of March.

As well as celebrating the cuisine, restaurant reviewers have also highlighted its 'warm and welcoming ambience in the heart of Verona'

He says the aim will be to create a similar buzz in Bahrain with a feel that encapsulates the desert sands alongside the waves and beauty of the Arabian Gulf.



As well as the look he knows Italian food connoisseurs and regulars of the Gulf Hotel outlet will judge him on the quality of the fare on offer.

"I believe in bringing real Italian cuisine and traditional recipes to the table with my own twist," he explained. "You must always remember that taste is the most important thing, you may make the dishes in a new way but you must always remember the taste."

Garfield Jones, CEO of Gulf Hotels Group, is delighted to have signed up such a culinary legend and thinks the vast sums to be invested in the restaurant's refurbishment, will be money well spent. Work will start in mid-May and it will remain closed until the grand reopening ceremony.

This will be the hotel's second venture with a Michelin-starred chef, following on from the introduction of Rasoi by

Vineet in 2015, which was not only voted best Indian restaurant but picked up the plumb prize of 'Best Restaurant' in the whole kingdom at last year's Bahrain Food and Travel Awards.

"Following on from the success of Rasoi by Vineet, we certainly expect great things from Chef Perbellini who will deliver the very best in Italian cuisine," Garfield added.

Not much pressure then? Although he will be a frequent visitor to the island in the coming months and conducting the kitchen orchestra well before the opening date, Xbe has already appointed a pair of safe hands - Zeno Bevilaqua and Matteo Mez – who are well-versed to the standards he sets.

One currently works in the kitchens of his Italian gourmet restaurant and the other was sous chef at his Hong Kong operation. "They know very well what we want to do here in Bahrain," he said. "We

will make something fresh. A new concept – we look at traditional Italian cuisine in a modern way, with our eyes and with our hearts."

Long-standing favourites on the current menu will remain in place such as the famous La Pergola Salad and he's not adverse to amending his own dishes to take account of local tastes, something he successfully adopted for the Chinese market in Hong Kong.

To tempt the taste buds, on the menu will be his unique Carbonara creation, an Italian pasta dish originating from Rome made with egg, hard cheese, guanciale and pepper and given a 'Xbe twist' with shrimps and there's also his take on Mozzarella cheese, which originates in Naples, and comes served with bread on the side. Langoustines with peas and mandarin and Millefeuille 'strachin' are firm favourites too.

Coming from a long line of pastry makers held in high regard since 1890, it's no surprise that Giancarlo is known for his desserts.

Despite working with some of Europe's greatest chefs, he says the most influential mentor he ever had was his grandfather. "My grandfather was a very important figure in my life," he explained. "From a young age he taught me how to make amazing pastry."

He keeps his memory alive in the kitchen, where his chefs often wear traditional waistcoats and flat caps, just as his grandfather would have done

Born in 1964 in Bovolone, a quiet town located in the Verona valley, Xbe's roots lie in the great Italian rural tradition, where the land and its produce are a fundamental resource. He grew up while resource. He grew up while cultivating a passion for pastry-making, kept alive by his family, and for cuisine, to which he decided to dedicate his studies and career.

His first steps were taken at the restaurant Marconi and 12 Apostoli in Verona, to then take off at San Domenico in Imola. The elegant and refined atmosphere at Gianluigi Morini's grande maison and the French inspiration of Nino Bergese's cuisine led him to important restaurants outside Italy, placing refinement alongside tradition.

From Taillevent to Ambroisie, as well as Terrasse in Juan Les Pins and Chateau d'Esclimont, thanks to his experience at these temples of cuisine, he created a foundation within haute cuisine.

In 1989, he opened an eponymous restaurant in Isola Rizza, where he was able to temper the taste of tradition with innovation. Three years later, in 1992, his hard work produced its first results - he was awarded the Chef Europeen du Poisson.

In 1996, Giancarlo Perbellini earned his first



Michelin star and in 1998 he was named Emerging Chef by the Espresso Guide. His second star was awarded in 2002, to which were added three forks from the Gambero Rosso Guide in 2005. He has been President of the Italian Commission of the prestigious competition for chefs, the Bocuse d'Or, since 2010

He disseminated his knowledge at four other restaurants and, along with other partners, endorsed the opening of the gourmet pizzeria Du de Cope, Locanda Quattro Cuochi, the restaurant Al Capitan della Cittadella and Tapasotto.

During the same years, he exported Italian culinary excellence abroad, curating the opening of the restaurant Rana in New York in November 2012. Then, in March 2014, he endorsed Locanda for the Indian group Dining Concepts, which opened in Hong Kong in the centrally-located Ocean Centre in Kowloon.

The Xbe world continues to be a contrast of the old and the new. It's one in constant evolution ... a gastronomic restaurant, a tapas bar, a pizzeria, a seafood table and even a boutique hotel. In Verona, Venice, New York, Hong Kong and now a venture into the Middle East with La Pergola by Perbellini in Bahrain







Dishing up a winning idea

The 26-year-old, a full-time student at Bahrain Polytechnic majoring in Management, is the founder of Prep-a-Plate, a business designed to streamline the food preparation process in order to prevent excess shopping and food consumption.

Nada, who lives in Hamad Town, said: "I used to have trouble managing my life as a student, a part-time employee and being a wife taking care of my family. I had so little time to think about myself and it all led me to gain lots of weight in so little time, and I faced serious health issues as a result.

"That is when I decided to go by a system where I'd pre-prepare all of my meal ingredients, freeze them and defrost them when I needed to cook, and even left my family members an easy 'how-to' description to follow on preparing any meal that included the ready ingredients.

"A while later, I started my studies in Bahrain Polytechnic and used this idea as a subject project."

She then developed the concept and came up with the Prep-a-Plate idea with encouragement from her tutor, Evelyn O'Donoghue.

Customers place orders for pre-prepared healthy meals through phone calls and text messaging, with an app in the pipeline for future project expansion. The food is delivered ready to be put straight in the oven, or the

stove, or in the microwave.
For busy business people and students this saves time and prevents waste from buying too many ingredients and weight gain from overindulging and snacking. Nada has more than 70 customers, many of whom are regular followers.

Her crowning achievement was coming first in the Bahrain leg of the Global Student Entrepreneur Awards (GSEA), dubbed as the premier global competition for



students who own and operate a business while attending college or university.

Nada competed against six other finalists and emerged victorious in front of a fourstrong judging panel made up of Tamkeen's Mohamed Ahamadi and Hassan Yaseem, Fareed Bader of Bader Group, and Esmahan Bokhowa, financial director of Bokhowa Group.

She will now fly to Toronto, Canada for the grand finals to be held on April 14-17, where she will compete against 55 other global participants.

Nada explained: "I was very honoured to win this competition, as the others had really bright ideas and promising businesses. I will be sure to use this success to strengthen my position in the market as the judges provided such important points of improvement on my business concept.

"To be honest, I am nervous about going to Toronto competing with students from all around the world with so many successful businesses, and all having their own dreams is overwhelming.

"As for my own future, the next step will be increasing my customer base, adopting new marketing methods and launching the app. I have always dreamed of having my own business and to be my own manager, so I would love to see Prep-a-Plate grow to have several branches or a big centre able to service the Bahrain population, and then several other branches in nearby countries such as Saudi Arabia and the UAE.

"Of course, I have to overcome the most difficult obstacle for any budding entrepreneur ... time management!

"I have great difficulty with this, what with studying, Prep-a-Plate, competitions, taking online courses to improve my business acumen, and family commitments. I try to devote a certain number of hours a day to each, and I'm so grateful for my family's support when I can't always give them full attention."

Nada's prowess has won her the acclaim of some of Bahrain's best business minds. Judge Esmahan, managing director of Saar Mall, believes Nada has the ability to go all the way. She said: "Nada had a unique project that she presented extremely confidently. It is of a benefit to lots of working people in society, making their lives easier."

"We decided to choose her as the winner because it was clear she had lots of knowledge about her project, with confidence that her business plan would succeed, and she also demonstrated how much research she had carried out."

Furthermore, the GSEA organiser and Nada's mentor, Safa Sharif, is proud of his student's accomplishments. He explained: "I had the chance to mentor Nada for 12 weeks during the Mashroo3i competition organised by Tamkeen, and it was a pleasure to get to know her

"Prep-a-Plate has a very good cause and adds value in so many aspects. Not only that, but Nada has always been very committed, focused and willing to develop. She had the right attitude from Day One so I was not surprised to see her win

Eating Out

The places to dine in Bahrain plus culinary tips for the food connoisseur



Burning desire to celebrate

HE quality of the cuisine is hotting up in the kingdom and 2018 looks like becoming the year of the flambé (French for 'flamed' or 'flaming') with presentational flair as the order of the day.

Only last week a culinary torch was used to produce a crust on a glorious crème brûlée at an Indian restaurant and this week a Polynesian paradise pulled off the party trick by the pool.

The technique is primarily executed for dramatic tableside presentation and brave food & beverage manager Bharathi Perumal, known as Barty to his friends, was on hand to perform the honours at Elite Crystal Hotel's Waikiki Kitchen.

The aim, apart from the fun of the exercise, is to leave behind a subtle, sweet flavour without reducing the food to a tonder. Barty has clearly perfected the art when it comes to putting the finishing touches to Chef Mohan's mighty prawns lovingly layered in a secret recipe spread of mighty buttery mustard.

Whether there is a change in flavour as a result of flambéing is unclear. Some claim that because the flame is above the food and since hot gases rise, it cannot significantly affect the flavour. Indeed, experimental work shows that most people cannot tell the difference.

That said, in an informal taste test conducted by one restaurant reviewer of two batches of caramelised apples

(one flambéed and one simmered), one tester declared the 'flambéed dish was for adults, the other for kids'.

I'd go along with that but readers can judge for themselves tonight and every Wednesday when this delightful dining out destination in Juffair delivers its Flaming Seafood Platter at just BD6++.

Chef Mohan, a native of Nepal, is one of my favourite chefs on the island who was introduced to the flavours of the South Sea during his 17-year culinary journey, and once presented me with the finest crab salad I have ever tasted.

His platter is cooked to perfection and apart of his star turn jumbo prawns, he delivers heavenly hammour, calamari and two varieties of marvellous mussels in the mix with small jacket potatoes and a tray of accompanying vegetables which were cooked to perfection.

Although I enjoy the South Sea Islands-inspired surrounds of the quaint restaurant, the pleasant weather made choosing a shaded cabana close to the pool the perfect place to dine with the good lady wife Kathryn and some friends.

The surrounding tall buildings offer a buffer to the wind and in the hot summer they even boast a clever air-conditioning chill for comfort if needed. Other nice touches included a beautiful basket of real flowers which added to the ambiance.

On the evening we visited an impressive guitarist/ vocalist called Richardo was entertaining folk from the poolside stage. He played a superb version of Santana's classic *Black Magic Woman*, which had us salivating in between courses for the real McCoy who will be headlining the Formula One party at Sikhir next month.

The big screen flickered on the water as Barcelona performed their magic on the pitch ... what a perfect evening, marvellous live music, footy and fabulous fare!

The service was swift and friendly thanks to our waiter Ronnie.

Chef Mohan was not going

to let me escape without tasting some of his other house specialities which included some cheeky little fried cheese balls, a superb salmon dish with smooth mashed potatoes, followed by the juiciest, chunkiest scallops possible. For those with a sweet tooth, a tray of bitesize chocolate treats was also presented.

Barty the party man has lots of other tricks up his sleeve for this special venue which includes a 'Wings Is Back' promotion every Thursday - apparently Waikiki Kitchen used to dish up unlimited Buffalo wings in the past, and regulars have demanded its return. For the uninitiated this is a hot favourite US cuisine featuring deep-fried chicken, coated in a cayenne pepper hot sauce and melted butter prior to serving.

Every Friday a Pool Party is also staged with a buffet and selected beverages included in the price

REVIEW: Rats in the Kitchen – Sherlock Holmes Lounge & Restaurant

THEY love their reggae and ska in Bahrain and following the success of the *One Step Behind* tribute show celebrating the music of Madness, now it was time to stomp along with 'dad dancing' steps to the sounds of LIBAO.

Rats in the Kitchen flew into Bahrain from the English city of Birmingham, home of the original band, to perform at The Gulf Hotel Bahrain's famous British public house-style venue with a crowd that knows how to party.

A bitter split has led to the original UB40 line-up splitting up with the brother of the lead singer now performing with one act and the lead vocalist behind all the chart hits, Ali Campbell, joining two other playmates, in another version. The latter appears to be keen on collecting air miles by regularly popping over to the kingdom to perform (twice in less than a year).

But we can't get enough of their classic tunes, like One in Ten, Falling in Love With You and Rat in Mi Kitchen which the cover band was inspired to play with for their name

Singer Box did a fair impression of the Campbells, supported by Longdraw, also on vocals and playing guitar, Bill on bass, KD on sax, Joey on keyboards and Bamboo on drums. The band delivered a fun couple of sets to keep the Friday Brunchers well and truly satisfied.

Although Rats in the Kitchen had more than 50 UB40 songs in the UK Singles Charts to choose from, they added numbers from a few others acts too, such as Bad Manners' Lip Up Fatty and even Dexys Midnight Runners' Come on Eileen.

Perhaps they got carried away by the atmosphere because they then destroyed my personal UB40 favourite, a reggae version of the Chi-Lites' classic soul hit *Homely Girl*, by regretfully speeding up the tempo. But I was on my own as far as any criticism was concerned. The dance floor was packed and the crowd was happy to sing along in harmony to everything the band delivered.

They'll never find a more enthusiastic audience ... and one that's looking forward to the Police tribute act set to shine at this venue next month. They'll be Walking on the Moon in anticipation.

IDEO artist Tamara Al-Mashouk, who went to school in Bahrain, is setting the art world alight in more ways than one ... as well as picking international awards and critical acclaim.

Born is Saudi Arabia, she moved to Bahrain in 2002, studied and worked in the US and has returned to the kingdom with plans for a new project here after a trip back to the UK to focus on a 'Gothic gingerbread villa'.

The 29-year-old's latest video work has received a Highly Commended Award from the Young Masters Art Prize Contest hosted by the Cynthia Corbett Gallery in London which attracted more than 750 entrants.

"It felt great exhibiting among some talented people. I didn't expect to win anything, especially coming into Young Masters with a video work - that was a surprise.

"Its aim was to spotlight art that has a relationship with the past. In my case this entailed critiquing the history of the male gaze. And, then there's the Mid-Century Modernist sculptural installation that I built then burnt down!"

Unsurprisingly, her work continues to turn heads and gained attention. Her video titled *License III* premiered at Gallery 8 in London and she was then invited to exhibit at The Royal Opera Arcade Gallery for the Young Masters 2.0 exhibition among selected shortlisted artists.

Tamara comes with an architecture background and six years of event production experience. She creates video installations for galleries as well as event-based art works for the public sphere.

She has produced large scale events and curatorial projects such as founding an annual all-female outdoor Fine Art Gallery at a music and arts festival in upstate New York and co-founded VISA Collectiv; two female Arab artists concerned with facilitating conversation and creating event based spaces to negotiate complex global conflicts through art.

She also installed a solo exhibit

featuring a five-channel video installation in the Mission Hill Gallery, Boston and curated an evening of video art screenings at 555 Gallery as a part of the city's Artweek event, premiered two experimental video art films at its Museum of Fine Arts and taken part in the group show titled Neither Here nor There at the Yuan Museum in Beijing, China.

But her inspiration for art and life started in Bahrain and continues to this day. "I moved to Bahrain in 2002 for high school, went to IKNS and had the quintessential high school experience. It's been home ever

"I'm obsessed with the monochrome beige in Saar, the graffiti that says 'Welcome to Vegas Baby', pictured below, and that small strip that has Alice in Wonderland on it and

"I currently live in Saar although for the past year or so I've been travelling a lot. I lived in Boston for nine years first for my undergrad, then a post bac diploma, then a masters, and some work study. "It's a magical place where I met incredibly talented and thoughtful people. I was able to work on a massive scale in Boston which kept me there and made me really push the limits of what I thought I could

do.
"The arts community within



academia and the underground is rigorous and challenging while staying really supportive. I left Boston after so long there to do an artist residency at the Brewery Artist Complex in LA. I needed to shake things up and challenge myself in new ways but I'll always go back to Boston as I'm still a member of an artist collective of event producers, musicians and artists there. And I still have friends there I care deeply about."

Tamara discovered video art in 2011. "I was transitioning from architecture to art," she explained, "and video provided the possibility of building worlds inside the screen and then in the tangible world by installing multiple projectors and screens.

"My first solo was a five channel video installation- each screen was 7' x 4' that I welded together and hung from the ceiling. I started projecting onto buildings, building massive sculptures in warehouses to project onto, and setting up screens in forests.

"Aside from how satisfying it feels to see the work take on these massive scales, I really just love playing with light and setting up complex systems to project on to.

"My most recent project in London involved two screens that started out completely hidden from the crowd and then dropped down in a cascade in a choreographed sequence. The projectors were also hidden and lit up as the screens dropped sequentially."

She then projected live videos on to them in a three-hour long video performance.

The show goes on and Tamara has plenty of plans packing her notebooks. "I'm always working on several projects at the same time," she said.

"I have a notebook that has one really messy page per project and my mind kind of travels between them. I'll see a scene in my head for one video and write it down. The videos kind of build like this until they're done.

"The one I'm most inspired by right now is a video I plan on filming sometime this year about a house built in 1852 by Thomas Allfree, tutor to the children of Nicholas I, the Tsar of Russia, on his return to England.

"I ended up at the house over Christmas and fell in love with it. It has such a rich history and hasn't had that many owners over the years - those who did own it transformed it while respecting its heritage. It's become this beautifully quirky incubus of history. It reminded me of the Rokeby Villa in Ragnar Kjartansson's *The Visitors*.

"I've also been planning a video work I'd like to film in Bahrain too - but that one's staying mine for a little bit longer!"

REVIEW: License III by Tamara Al-Mashouk

License III by Tamara Al-Mashouk is slow, breathtaking anarchy. It's six minutes and 38 seconds of a monument burning to the ground in slow motion in the pouring rain.

Al-Mashouk's work explores a dichotomous existence. One that simultaneously understands and critiques the social politics of being a contemporary Middle Eastern woman.

One that doesn't reject it, one that celebrates an alternative narrative, her narrative.

Her work is an unbridled exploration of how all of her parts come together and her tone is refreshingly honest and captivating.

License III is the final iteration of a three year series in which Al-Mashouk explores the relationship between the institution and the other. In its first form, License I is a two channel video that pictures Al-Mashouk using her body as a vessel for resistance through playful and challenging performance amongst brutalist architecture. It's strong, bold, and daring. It leaves us at once exhausted and exhilarated as with each fall she rises.

The sound of her falls echo, and leave us feeling bruised, celebrating our bruises as temporary tattoos of resistance.

License II sees the work transform into the midcentury modernist monument to be ultimately burned for License III. The installation from License II featured three performers, their positions in the massive installation defined by custom built spaces. They are contained and their intersectional narratives are housed within their performance and are freed and celebrated as the structure erupts in flames.

The transformation throughout the series from medium to medium, from narrative to narrative, from video to sculpture and back to video is a testament to Al-Mashouk's commitment to reworking core concepts and inclusivity. And, it is this same transformation that imbues the finale with explosive definition.

The burn is tragic and beautiful. The burn burns for all of us and we can all celebrate our freedom within the smoke and the entrancing burning embers.

Reminiscent of Mies van der Rohe's Farnsworth house and Philip Johnson's Glass House. Al-Mashouk deconstructs mid-century Modernisms core elements with License III. She brings them to the forefront by the ordering of private and public spaces by placing them, dissected, on display for us. It's impeccably constructed, it's white lines draw in space, it's an uninhabitable home, and what it houses is an anonymous woman. And so, there are few things more satisfying than watching the same woman stand in front of the sculpture, flame in hand.

While the English voice over is bold and empowered, the Arabic is more self-reflective as the artist dissects the relationship between herself, her background and her aspirations. Both, however, weave together stories all too familiar to women globally.

The ambiguity lends itself to the ubiquity of every woman's experience, and it is this ebb and flow between the personal and the universal, between specificity and obscurity, that creates such a powerful connection to the work.

The editing is fluid, each pan seamless, and each shot absolutely crisp. The pans are reminiscent of Amie Siegel's camera movement in Provenance, and there is a hint of Ragnar Kjartanssen's bubbling rebellion.

Each shot celebrates the sensuality of destruction, and the moments of heavy rain juxtaposed with the fire are enchantingly violent.

License III uproots your insides and leaves you wanting more and I for one cannot wait to join Al-Mashouk's triumphantly dazzling artistic revolution

An educational insight and comment by head teacher Chris Fenton

OW long does it take for a child to be influenced by their parents? Some research shows that a growing child learns things such as sleeping patterns and daily routines from inside the womb and, of course, physically we can all see little bits of ourselves in our children's facial features or movements.


But physical and prenatal influences aside, how parents influence their children depends on exactly how much time they invest in both their physical and emotional development. For example, sometimes, just being physically present is not enough. A Harvard University study showed that parents that may be nearby but that are not emotionally invested or responsive tend to raise children that are more distressed and less engaged with their play or activities

A further study investigating the connection

between parent's investment and children's competence suggests that the emotional involvement of parents really does matter and affects the outcome of their child's ability to both understand and regulate their emotions.

Parents should keep this in mind when considering the quality of the time they spend with their children, because if they do not invest enough of their time and commitment into pouring emotionally into their child, the evidence suggests that the child will potentially struggle to learn important life skills such as interacting with others appropriately.

But the concept of parent / child interaction and influence goes even further since children learn exponentially from what their parents do as much as what they say, (the child of an alcoholic, for example, is statistically more likely to turn to substance abuse in adult life) and the example, therefore, that we set them, is of paramount importance.



It's very rare to be able to pinpoint the exact moment in which a child's behaviour patterns change for the worse as a result of their parents actions, but recently I heard of someone who witnessed this first hand.

A particularly unpleasant parent who had a habit of screaming at teachers and demonstrating all sorts of brattish behaviour whenever anything regarding her child's school life was discussed, (a broken pencil case or a missing school tie, for example) took particular offence when her son's test results dipped.

Rather than taking the necessary steps of discussing whether her child understood the work or was having problems at school she decided to blame the school entirely and with test paper in one hand and said child in the other she marched into the coordinator's office, slammed the exam paper on the desk and began screaming in characteristic fashion at both the teacher and coordinator herself

This delightful lady blamed

the school, the teachers and even their nationalities without once thinking that a pair of young eyes was watching everything that she did and a young brain was deciphering her actions and deciding that screaming, shouting and blaming everyone-else must be the right way to go in life because it certainly got a reaction.

From the moment the woman's hand slapped the test paper on to the desk, her son's behaviour changed for the worse and has continued in that vein ever since.

If the boy does not get his own way, he screams and shouts at everybody and tells them that they don't know what they are doing. Ominously, he is showing racist tendencies too.

This is perhaps an extreme example, but it is something that teachers and head teachers do experience in their careers from time-to-time and it certainly draws attention to the importance of thinking before acting when children are nearby.



New spin on sport



, Tonya takes on truth, sport and relationships in a no-holds-barred dark comedy turned tragedy. This is dieselflued figure skating, more like a knockout boxing match than Swan Lake in technical artistry.

This biopic, centred around the life of the prolific competitive US figure skater Tonya Harding, deals with her rise to the top of the sport's ranking.

Watching Tonya skate at the time was a breath of fresh air in a staling championship, the first US woman to land a triple axel. She was extremely talented, yet hindered on all sides by an abusive mother, abusive husband and a biased system.

Harding's future in the sport was thrown into doubt when her ex-husband intervened in her career, accused of conspiring to assault her greatest competitor, Nancy Kerrigan.

Margot Robbie plays Tonya Harding, and there's good reason for her Academy Award for Best Actress nomination for this role. She is phenomenal and captivating, down to the slack-jawed, slurred inflection in Harding's speech and her eager-toplease wink to the camera.

Her Tonya is rock 'n' roll on ice, blasting full volume, uncensored and just insanely talented. Robbie's face is so expressive that often the distance between desperate rage and euphoria is no greater than the edge of a blade.

Alison Janney, who plays Tonya's mother, LaVonda, has all the warmth of a prickly cactus, daring anyone to come close for fear of a pointed barb to

the face. She's less a mother and more a savage drill sergeant.

Janney earns her own *Best Supporting Actress* win through subtlety and timing, her pursed lips a constant disapproval of her daughter's life during the highs as well as the lows.

Everyone in this film is kind of an idiot, but no-one takes the cake more so than Jeff Gillooly, Harding's exhusband, played by Sebastian Stan, and his out-of-touch sociopathic best friend, Shawn, played by Paul Walter Hauser. Jeff does a stellar job teaching you how to hate him, a free course in what not to do as a man, husband, or conspirator.

There's an electrifying vibe of 1990s paranoia that hangs about the whole



film. Everyone is frantic and frazzled, like they're connected to a faulty battery pack that might fry them all at a moment's notice.

The script is beautifully composed, like a choreographed battle between a pathological world and a perfectly sculpted one, with a once-in-a-lifetime talent trapped in between. All Tonya wants is to skate and be loved, but it seems no-one is willing to give her a chance at either.

If you've never watched figure skating, then *I, Tonya* is a flashbang introduction. In this sport, the competitors are masters of physics, bending the ice to their will all the while balancing on razor-thin edges.

The routines are beautiful, nervewracking and you're half out of your seat punching the air by the moment they land.

It's also just really darkly funny. The faux documentary snippets are brimming with ironic self-reflection and vastly differing accounts of the same story. They all insist they know what happened and most of the time, they're talking nonsense.

You'll have to make up your own mind about whether or not Tonya Harding had anything to do with the assault on Nancy Kerrigan. As Tonya herself notes, everyone has their own truth.





Classic cars touch the heart

HEY came sporting stickers in their cars with a simple message proclaiming a love and devotion for a Japanese marque with certificates of appreciation on show under their windscreens and a particular Z...est for one model in particular.

The passion was clear to see as devotees of classic cars gathered outside the Y.K. Almoayyed & Sons' Nissan & INFINITI dealership in Sitra for the staging of the second edition of a popular motor show with music booming out and food being distributed.

All original interiors and exteriors without a scratch were earnestly displayed although some boasted special artwork painted on the inside of the bonnets, one paying homage to the late, great Bahraini singer Ali Bahar and his Brothers band.

Once upon a time the global sports car market was dominated by British manufacturers with MG, Triumph, Healey and Jaguar ruling the roads. Their domination was being challenged by Italian giants Alfa Romeo and Fiat but inroads suddenly came from the place where the sun rises

Japanese car manufacturers started wooing folk with perfectly-priced economic and reliable runners and Bahrain was no different but then they started pursuing a higher degree of respect from the West and Middle East by building a world-class sports

The first to accomplish that mission was the 1969 Nissan Fairlady Z, which was known as the Datsun 240Z overseas

The birth of 240Z was driven by Yutaka Katayama, the boss of Nissan US then and now known as 'the father of Z-cars'. The story goes that he visited the research and development department in Japan, persuading the chief engineer and designer to develop a stunning sports car instead of continuing making cheap economy cars forever.

His words moved them, the project got the green light and project code 'Z' was born. Four years later, the production car went on sale. It was called the Fairlady Z at its home market following the tradition of Nissan sports cars (note: Nissan had been building the unremarkable Fairlady roadster series since 1959). But Mr K preferred a stronger name for export market and called it the 240Z instead, where the number represented its engine displacement.

The Z-car was beautiful. Its styling was probably influenced by an earlier study prototype penned by Albrecht Goertz, who was renowned for BMW 507 and then had a short stint at Nissan until 1964 - and that led to the speculation that it was designed by Goertz. However, the car was equally inspired by the contemporary Ferraris and Jaguar E-type

Anyway, it was by no means a copycat. Nissan created a car

that looked not only original but far more modern than its nearest rivals, and would be compared to the more expensive Jaguar and Porsche offerings.

The upmarket look was supported with modern technologies, such as allindependent suspensions, front disc brakes, five-speed gearbox and an SOHC

straight-six engine producing 151 gross horsepower. It was capable of 0-60 mph in eight seconds or so, and reaching a top speed of 125 mph.

The 240Z was also praised by road testers for not only good performance but also good handling and roadholding.

The passion for the car remains evident today

Mechanic and shop owner Anwar Shaar, 26, for Seef, owns a 1973 version and said: "I love it. Every time I sit in the driver's seat I appreciate what a very special car this is."

Stables owner Jassim Salman, 33, from Adliya, proudly drove off with secondplace and a BD500 prize in the highly-competitive Batelco Motor Show with his beloved

1982 280ZX Turbo which he imported from the US at a cost of BD6,000 six years ago.

A good investment too, as it's now worth around BD8,000. And, although he drives a BMW for the daily commute, nothing quite beats this beast and it's not just what's under the bonnet either. "It's hard to put into words," he admitted, "but there's something wonderful about this car.

"Somehow, it feels like family. My father drove a Datsun when I was a child and I still get a wonderful sense and smell and warm memories as soon as I open the car door. Those early days sort of rubbed off on me and I just knew I needed to have one. This is my baby, my lovely

Although come 1986, and with the Datsun brand firmly established across the world, Nissan decided it was about time it marketed its cars under the parent brand's name plate.

No matter the name the following continues to grow. In Bahrain the marque boasts a Z Club, GT-R Club, Datsun Club, Patrol Club and an INFINITI Team ... plus the love affair with the Z continues unabated.

Sitting stylishly in the showroom was a 370Z gathering glances of admiration from the visitors. As long as there's been a Nissan Z, there has been a soulful six-cylinder leading the way and this one will cost you just short of BD40,000.

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Paul packs title punch



With the organising committee kicking-off preparation activities more than six months ago, the event got under way on Thursday with player registration and a welcome reception.

HE 30th Bahrain **Ladies Open Golf** Championship was hosted at Awali Golf Club last weekend, with 32 players from Bahrain and overseas locations in the field, including last year's champion Fiona Elsdon. as well as Sarah Hobday and Lynn St. Lawrence, champions in 2016 and 2015 respectively.

Day 1's play started in a blustery north-westerly wind and a light rain shower, the gloomy skies gradually brightening during the day but with winds remaining around 20 knots

After the first nine holes, Jo Pawson and Dena Wales led the field, both on gross 44, with Stacey Thomas chasing them with 45. Elsdon, seen as the bookies' favourite to repeat her 2017 podium position, followed in a group with 46, along with St. Lawrence, Hobday and Nicola Bailey

Completion of the back nine resulted in a re-arrangement of the leader board. Thomas edging ahead with a gross 46 to total 91 for the day, one ahead of five joint-secondplace players: Elsdon (46/46), St. Lawrence (46/46), Wales (44/48), Susan Scott (47/45) and Ariette Paul (47/45).

Thomas's play was also noteworthy in that she carded two of only three birdies over the whole day, Paul achieving the third. Rounding off the Top 10 placings at the end of Day 1, a further four players looked as though they were still in with a chance, being within five shots of the leader. namely Nicola Park (95). Sarah Hobday (96), Johanna Hassett (96) and Kerry Diaper

Clear blue skies greeted Day 2 play together with a slightly reduced wind speed. Teeingoff last, the two leading groups comprised Scott, Wales and Paul, with the final grouping of Elsdon, St. Lawrence and Thomas

Both with 95 for the second day, Scott (48/47) and St. Lawrence (49/46) slipped from contention, as did Wales with 98 (51/47). Overnight leader Thomas started her round shakily with bogey, double bogey, double bogey and finished her front nine with gross 50. Although carding

a respectable 46 for her back nine to total 96 for the day, she slid down the leader board and waved her overnight lead goodbye.

Paul, in the second-to-last group, commenced her Day 2 play steady, but then managed a quadruple bogey 9 stumble on Hole-5, luckily to regain her composure with a birdie-4 on the par-5 Hole-7, helping her to a front-nine score of 46 and a tally of 138 over 27 holes.

With a birdie on the par-4 11th together with pars on Holes 12, 14, 15 and 17, the back nine saw Paul engage cruise control and great play to achieve the Championship's best nine-hole score with a gross 41, finishing the round with gross 87 and a competition total of 179, placing her at the top of the leader board.

Elsdon commenced her Day

2 without major hiccup, a birdie-4 on Hole 7 helping her to a front-nine score of 42 and a tally of 134 over 27 holes. Elsdon's back nine started bogey, par, birdie to keep her on track, but a triple bogey on Hole 13 and a double bogey on Hole 15 saw her safe position evaporate. As Elsdon commenced her play at Hole 17, she needed to putt out over the last two holes in eleven shots or better so as to win.

A bogey-6 on Hole 17 meant she still had a chance, but the par-5 she needed on the 18th proved elusive, her score of 6 being one too many. The upshot: a nineteenth hole playoff to decide the Championship, starring Ariette Paul and Fiona Elsdon.

After the formalities of posting scores, the two leaders, caddies and equipment were chauffeured back to 18th tee this location being chosen so

that the players can have the pleasure of being watched by the assembled crowd at the clubhouse vet again.

Bathed in orange as the sun started to set, the battle commenced with Paul drawing the short straw to tee off first And, a very confident tee shot it was: almost up to the fairway

The more diminutive Elsdon remained calm, also to place her tee shot nicely in the middle of the fairway, but 50 yards short of Paul's monster.

Elsdon played her second, not quite reaching the road and slightly to the right of centre, leaving a distance of about 80 vards to the green. Paul, for her second, made another solid connection, across the road but not straight: the ball ending in the left rough at 50 yards cueing up a difficult third shot up to the green, the lie having a somewhat restricted back

swing courtesy of an adjacent shrub. Elsdon played her third competently up toward the green, but a couple of yards short of the putting surface. A good chip and a putt would see her down in par. The commotion on the terrace became a hush.

A final word from Paul's caddy Floris Brand and he stepped back. With a descending blow with her iron, Paul lifted the ball sweetly into the air, it striking near the top of the bank. It rolled and rolled some more.

The terrace commotion returned and got louder and louder, and became a roar as the ball cruised to a halt one foot from the pin. With what was probably the shot of the Championship, Paul had a surefire birdie

To force a second play-off, Elsdon now had to produce a chip-in from off the green. A tall order that was not to be. the ball rolling past the hole by a few metres and needing a two-putt for her to finish with a 6. Paul stepped forward, and with a simple tap-in, her worthy birdie won her the Championship.

Club Captain Paul Anderson was master-of-ceremonies for the presentation, starting with thanks to the sponsors. organising committee, roving photographer and other helpers.

He then presented the prizes, assisted by tournament director Mark Hodgkinson.

By popular demand, Paul took the microphone and thanked everyone that had made the event so enjoyable, gave special thanks to her caddy, and finished by summarising her day with: "I wasn't prepared for this!'

Halo unhappiness

ORMULA One driver Pierre Gasly expects to be ripping through racesuits this season after complaining that the sport's new halo headprotection device had torn holes in his overalls as he got in-and-out of the car.

The 22-year-old Frenchman, starting his first full season with Red Bull-owned Toro Rosso, expressed his frustration after completing 82 laps of a cold Circuit de Catalunya on the second day of pre-season testing.

"I don't like it (the halo). It's just a big mess to get in the car and get out," he said. "I think my suit is already broken. We'll have to ask for many suits from supplier Alpine Stars this season.

"It's only the first day in the car and I have many holes on the back. You need to be a lot backward to slide into the car. It's actually quite weird.

"With all the winglets you have on the halo you cannot really pull, to get out you cannot really touch it.

The halo, which extends up from a central pillar to



circle the driver's head, is designed to protect against flying objects and is making mandatory safety addition. Getting in and out, particularly for taller drivers, is more awkward than when cockpits were





completely open. There are also concerns that in the rare cases of a car flipping over or being set on fire, that drivers may find it impossible to pull themselves out without external help.

Haas driver Kevin Magnussen also spoke of his reservations about the new device. He said: "It's very annoying. Ugly. Difficult to get into the car, difficult to get out of the car, difficult to get the steering wheel on and off, just awkward and

annoying."
Though he ruled out any problem seeing start lights, Magnussen suggested there were some types of corner where the device could prove a distraction, such as high elevation turns like Eau Rouge at Spa, Belgium and Turn 1 in US track in Texas.

"Once you get into the corner it's fine because you look to the sides and left and right of the pillar in the middle so it's not a problem visually to see the corner, but it distracts your eye obviously when you change direction like chicanes and you have to move your vision across the pillar," he

Series success goes regional

Hussain Al Kooheji, cofounder of Motogulf, BSBK's parent company, said: "This round was the most interesting round of BSBK so far, in my opinion. We have seen an absolute shuffle in standings and this has been an outstanding experience for all with the backdrop of thrilling racing.

"Racing on different circuits in the same season has been a very exciting concept for us and the riders. We are glad we have been able to execute this well and hope to take BSBK to more circuits in the coming season."

The final and concluding round of BSBK will also be held in Bahrain on April 20.

If the sport's executives decide to return to the Middle East for testing, then the kingdom would be willing, ready and able, according to Bahrain International Circuit's chief executive officer Shaikh Salman Bin Isa AI Khalifa.

He said: "The BIC has always welcomed the opportunity to hold testing for Formula One and has successfully hosted several tests in previous years.

"The decision remains in the hands of Formula One Management, the teams and Pirelli, but, as always, if BIC was selected as the venue for winter testing, we will do all what is needed to ensure the testing programme is successful. The circuit is well known and the conditions are representative of what the cars would face over the course of a season."

Of the four days which encompassed the first preseason test, only the fourth day had any significant times posted. Unfortunately for those expecting a shift in the status quo, four-times world champion Lewis Hamilton was back on top of the timesheets for Mercedes.

The Briton, who had driven only 25 laps earlier in the week, completed 69 more



with a fastest time of One Minute 19.333 seconds using the medium Pirelli tyres.

"I was really happy to get out, to be honest," Hamilton said afterwards. "I don't like testing but I actually was really keen to get out, obviously because we hadn't had many laps ... to get a feel for the tyres and warm-up process and kind of stretchthe-legs a little bit on this new car. So far it's positive."

new car. So far it's positive.

The pace of the Mercedes came as no surprise, with the team having won the last four drivers' and constructors' titles, and they already look the team to beat even though testing times can be deceptive.

Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel, also a four-times champion and last year's runner-up, has already said that Hamilton and Mercedes will be favourites when the season starts in Australia on March 25.



Belgian Stoffel Vandoorne, in the now Renault-powered McLaren after the team's split with Honda at the end of last year, did 110 laps and was second quickest, although he was using the much faster hyper-soft tyres. Vandoorne's time of 1:19.854 was still half a second slower than Hamilton's.

The Belgian's Spanish team mate and double world champion Fernando Alonso did another 51 laps and was fifth on the timing screens in an altogether much more positive showing for the team partly-owned by Bahrain's sovereign wealth fund, Muntalakat.

French driver Pierre Gasly, in the Honda-powered Toro Rosso, did the most mileage - an impressive 147 laps - while Vettel completed 120 and was third fastest on a day that started wet but dried

"I'd have liked to have driven more, but we can do that hopefully at the second test, when we will start to get a clearer picture," said Vettel, who spent some time in the garage as mechanics worked on the car.

The second and final preseason test started yesterday and will run until Friday.

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ORMULA One team bosses sent a clear 'wish we were there!' message to the kingdom this week after a disastrous first pre-season test in Barcelona, writes Kristian Harrison.

Heavy snow fell across Europe and the Circuit de Catalunya did not escape the white wrath as the track was blanketed, leaving many executives wondering why testing could not take place in warmer Bahrain.

Haas team principal Guenther Steiner had plenty to say about the situation after the third day of testing was completely wiped out due to the arctic weather conditions. He fumed: "This is not a normal cold for Barcelona. There is a whole cold front going through Europe. At the moment I'd love to be in Bahrain at 30C and standing in the sun.

"In these current conditions, you can do a little bit more than systems checks. You can check some aero data. Whenever you go out with these cars you learn something. But is it efficient testing? By no means."

Bahrain International Circuit previously hosted a successful test in 2014, with many teams expressing satisfaction at the circuit's suitability and hospitality for testing, but the decision was made later that year to host future tests in Barcelona.

The rationale behind the reduced number of tests was to lower the costs for teams. With so many outfits struggling financially, it was decided that for logistical and cost-cutting reasons, it made sense to host the tests in Europe where all 11 teams are based.

However, the downside of this is that it makes little sense when the test conditions in brrrr ... late February and early March in Europe bear little resemblance to those that cars experience in racing throughout the season, especially with baking Australia and balmy Bahrain being the first two races of the season.

Races in the Southern Hemisphere and nearer the Equator are scheduled for the beginning and end of the season to take advantage of conditions, whilst the European trail takes place throughout the continent's summer for similar reasons.

summer for similar reasons.

It was not just team bosses who had misgivings about Barcelona, but the drivers too ... with Bahrain close to their thoughts and hearts. Red Bull's Daniel Ricciardo said: "The reality is that we are never going to drive in these conditions. Part of me wishes we were somewhere else like Bahrain where you can get some real testing in real temperatures. I don't want to be negative but it is a bit frustrating when you can't do too much."

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
