HERE is no knocking down tough teenager Maddie Harrison-Mirfield as she sweeps past some of the best K-1 kickboxing athletes from around the globe in a fierce international competition and is crowned world champion in the combat sport.

The 15-year-old St Christopher's School student kicked off her summer break in the UK with her family cheering her onto victory in the 2018 World Kickboxing Organisation (WKO) World Championship K-1 Light Ladies category. K-1 is a fighting format that combines the most skilful and effective elements of kickboxing. Muay Thai, Karate and Taekwondo.

And while this is a big win for the British expat who lives in Saar, due to the fact that it's her first major competition and in her country, what makes the golden glory even sweeter is that she is representing the kingdom that she has called home for the past 12-and-ahalf years

"It feels amazing – flying Bahrain's flag internationally and being able to come home WKO world champion in K-1 is beyond anything I could have asked for," she said. "This opportunity was just crazy! It was my first major competition and to increase the pressure, it was in my home country. But I was proud to be representing the flag that has my heart ... Bahrain!"

During the three-day competition, Maddie took on two top contenders in the K-1 and the K-1 Light category, challenging women that weighed more than her and were older.

Maddie's first K-1 Light Ladies fight was against Brit Rachel Rose, 23, who trains at the Ni Yai Muay Thai Sheffield gymnasium run by retired professional fighter Kru Christian 'Rambo' Di Paolo.

Maddie represented Reza's Martial Arts Centre (RMAC) founded by head coach Reza Monfaradi and she was sponsored by Tru Active, Bahrain's leading active wear brand, as a Tru Active athlete and brand ambassador. She has been training at RMAC for the past two-and-a-half years under the tutelage of Hussain Ayad, Hassan Ayad and Ali Al Showaikh and Reza himself.

According to Maddie, the fight was a straight final featuring three one-minute rounds that were short and quick. "I didn't begin the fight brilliantly," she explained. "I wasn't used to the short rounds and before I knew it, it was up! However, I did get some hefty punches in.

"Going into the second round I knew what needed to be done which were straight punches through the middle and kicks to finish it off

"My competitor got tired pretty fast. That is also how I played the third round and it paid off. When the bell rang we embraced as all fighters do – a sign of respect – and

then we went to each other's corners and thanked the coaches.

"I went back to my corner and removed my gloves; head guard and gum shield and picked up the flag I was so proud to hold up high. The referee brought us back to the middle and raised my hand – a truly exhilarating moment!"

Her second bout in the K-1 category was against British Shannon Canavan from the Spartan Fighting Arts Academy and she was her toughest opponent yet. She also competes in the WKO England national team.

"I went into the ring knowing she would throw hard heavy punches and she definitely did," Maddie added. "I stood my ground though, giving her the worst nosebleed I've seen and it went all over me. However, that wasn't enough of an edge for the referees.

"In the end I lost by split decision and due to a warning nearing the end of round three. Though this was a loss, I learnt so much more from this fight and don't regret a single thing I did as it's all a part of my learning process in this sport."

Head coach Reza is proud of her accomplishment and expected nothing less. "We are all so happy and proud of her at the centre," he said. "Personally, I expected a victory from her because she had been training really hard and is a great competitor.

"I was a little disappointed at first when I heard she was competing in the adult category as she is a juvenile. However, adult or not, she still defeated the other contender and she was a much bigger girl too.

"I definitely don't think any girl could beat her in the juvenile category as she is a strong and powerful competitor. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to go with her but when she arrived in the UK she found a place to continue preparing and staying in shape in the lead up to her fights.

"She is a star and I do see a lot of potential in her. If


she keeps the same mind set and training regime she will definitely be a champion which she already is!"

Maddie believes she owes a lot of her achievements to the constant support of her mum Lucy, who runs the FAB Bahrain directory, dad Stephen, the chief operating officer at The Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland - Medical University of Bahrain, her brothers that both attend St Christopher's School Ben. 14. and Elliott. nine, and of course her coaches. Her parents would drive her to the centre for two hours of training, six-days-aweek.

"They are my biggest fans," she said. "Also, I can't thank my Muay Thai coaches Hussain, Hassan and Ali enough for their support and for paying such close attention to my progress and always pushing me to my limits.

"Then there is head coach Reza who has promoted my skills outside the gym as well as in the gym and assisted me into becoming the fighter I am today. I owe a lot to him.

"Then there are all my training partners. The list is so long and they all need recognition for the time and effort they have put in with me. But, if there is one person I needed to mention, it would be Sarah Harris. We are the two active female fighters in the gym and we train together all the time. My success is



Maddie originally took up Muay Thai, which is Thai boxing that uses stand-up striking along with various clinching techniques, to help her de-stress from school.

"At the end of Year 8, I was told by my form tutor Aneil Peswani to branch out from the crowd and do something independently and different," she explained. "I chose Muay Thai as a release from all the work we were doing at school and all the troubles that come with growing up in this developing world. Never did I think that it would get this far!"

Since then Maddie's love for the sport grew from strength to strength and she competed in Bahrain Sports Day where she won by TKO (technical knock out) in the third round of her fight. She also participated in the Bahrain Open Championship, however, her opponent forfeited.

Maddie is planning to train harder than ever before to make her dreams of becoming a professional fighter a reality. "The dream is to go pro but I know I have a long way to go," she said. "There is definitely a growing amount of women in martial arts in Bahrain which is great to see. Most of the girls are not active fighters though and are mostly just doing it to get fit or for fun. It would be great to see more women getting the confidence in themselves to fight.

"If there was more of an uptake it would be great to organise a female fight night to display our killer skills in the ring. I'm looking forward to competing more in Bahrain whenever I can and I will definitely be returning to the UK next year to compete again at the WKO world championships

championships.
"I hope to eventually be part of the national team and compete with a full team overseas and make the country that has my heart so proud!"

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Sanctuary for

Ringlin Maklai has opened her heart and her home to the kingdom's strays with the aim of nourishing them back to life and helping them find forever homes.

The mother-of-two, who spent 16 years working in the Turkish Embassy, is dedicating her time to help manage the stray situation in Bahrain by nurturing as many felines and canines as possible.

"Pets are often discarded when their owners don't want them anymore," Rengin explained. "Who will look after them, let alone the strays? When they're babies, everyone loves them, but when they get older, excuses start.

"Looking after an animal is a life-long commitment. I am not a shelter or a veterinary clinic. I am an individual doing my best."

Her home is overrun with 26 cats, of which 25 were picked up off the streets, and four dogs, of which three are rescues. In addition to this, she also feeds 15 to 20 stray cats outside her property.

"My family loves animals as much as I do," Rengin said. "And by the way, I'm not alone in that! There are lots of animal lovers in Bahrain. For example, a couple of my dear friends are doing a wonderful job in taking care of rescues as well such as Duaa Al Alawi, who has 29 cats."

All her animals have been either neutered or spayed as well as vaccinated and she often tries to do the same for the strays too.

According to various shelters and clinics, spaying and neutering can help control the overpopulation of homeless pets in Bahrain.

Rengin's husband Yaqub, a Bahraini contractor, believes



her big-hearted endeavour by revamping their guest house seven years ago into a sanctuary for her fur family.


The guest house, which has been dubbed the Cat House, features three bedrooms, two living rooms, a netted patio area for fresh air and two larger rooms that have been converted into catteries.

Living in the Cat House are two dogs and 14 cats, some which are healthy and others which need attention. Rengin has two care-givers assisting her with the special cases.

The house is partitioned to support each animals' needs. One room is for dogs, one is used for healthy cats, two rooms are for cats undergoing long-term medical treatment and one room is for six cats with Feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV), which is a deadly disease.

The virus, which cannot be transferred to humans acts in the same way as HIV - destroying the immune system and leaving a cat susceptible to infections and disease. FIV is spread mostly through bite wounds inflicted while fighting with other cats but can also be transmitted by a mother cat to her kittens across the placenta or through her milk. Outdoor cats are at the highest risk of disease, especially if they fight with other cats.

"When I see an animal in need, there is no question about it," she explained. "I am there to help! First, I take

them to the vet to see if they have any health issues then I foster them until they can be up for adoption.

"While I have managed to get dozens of cats and dogs adopted, the reality is that nobody wants strays so I end up keeping them.

Rengin believes that one of the biggest issues in Bahrain when it comes to the handling of strays is cruelty and that the way to mend this is through education and awareness.

"There are many animals in Bahrain that have been tortured," she said. "Dog poisonings were very common from January to March. These creatures depend on our humanity. There are lots of problems in

"I feel responsible for animals because they can't speak for themselves. I can respect people who don't like animals, but I cannot and will not respect people who act maliciously towards them. What we need is to educate them on how to properly treat animals and through that the love will come.

Rengin also believes that pet abandonment is a major issue and that it can be solved through a registry system.

"Just as people register for residency, animals should be registered too," Rengin explained. "Their existence should be proven. Are they alive, dead - what happened to them? This eliminates the problem of people buying pets then dumping them. Careless pet owners have to be held accountable.

difficult part about looking after all these animals is how time-consuming and tiring it can be, Rengin also adds that the most fulfilling part about getting a rescued animal adopted into a caring home is knowing that they have brighter days ahead. Most adopters keep in touch with her, even if they leave the island.

She added: "If I feel a potential adopter is unfit to take care of the animal, I do not give them up. I have to be 100 per cent certain. When these animals are safe, that makes it worth the exhaustion. This is what true happiness feels like. There is not one day where I regret accepting the responsibility that I have taken in being their spokesperson and

Aside from managing her own little zoo, she has been aiding organisations across the kingdom.

Two years ago, Rengin and her friend Colleen Hegarty, who is a Harvard University student, started rescuing cats and dogs from Arman Zoo to find homes for them in the US. They rescued a total of 26 cats and 30 dogs, all of which have been homed in Bahrain and the US

Rengin also works with Emtinan Zidany, the founder of Precious Paws Bahrain which addresses the needs of homeless and rescued animals as well as providing both local and international adoption opportunities for strays in Bahrain such as sending dogs abroad.

She also volunteers at Tony the Dogfather Animal Rescue & Rehabilitation Centre as well as helping animals at the BSPCA

The places to dine in Bahrain plus culinary tips for the food connoisseur



Magic Mediterranean meal

FTER a week of birthday celebrations and stuffing cake, sweets and chocolate into my mouth, I was crying out for some healthy food to get back on track with my fitness regime.

Thankfully, Mawasim Restaurant & Lounge provided the perfect opportunity as myself, marketing manager Jalal Muradi and photographer Honey Sharma were treated to an outstanding Mediterranean breakfast on Saturday.

The bright and breezy outlet was the perfect tonic for a boiling hot summer's day, eliciting feelings of holidaying and enjoying some fine fare.

Celebrated Jordanian Chef Maher Ramzi is the culinary wizard in charge at the restaurant, located at the booming Galleria Mall in Zini

He commands a strong following after spellbinding work over a five year spell at popular dining destinations in Bahrain, and in the space of a couple of hours and numerous courses proved exactly why he deserves it.

He explained: "The menu is a medley, it's a fusion actually, it's my creativity plated. There are Arabic touches with bold yet simple flavours of the Mediterranean.

"The Arabic name of the restaurant means 'seasons' and our aim is to create meals for all seasons covering all the glorious seasons across the Mediterranean coast."

Mediterranean cuisine combines a vast range taking in all the countries that border the sea - Spain, France, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Syria, Palestine, Egypt, Algeria, Libya, Tunisia and Morocco.

All of these influences were clear to see on the breakfast menu, starting with the Hummus Poulet, a creamy and flavourful homemade hummus packed with marinated chicken liver and pomegranate molasses, and the Caramelised Foul Hummus, topped with lemon

green chili sauce and fresh herbs.

Now, if you're anything like me, then you can't properly start a day without a nice cuppa. Mawasim provides a wide variety on its breakfast menu, such as chamomile, lemongrass, Moroccan or the old favourite, yet still unrivalled, English breakfast

This time, however, I plumped for the Chai Karak, which I usually enjoy in a small cardboard cup from the little shops dotted around Bahrain. For a change, I wanted to try it brewed in a teapot and I'm glad I did,

with the more bitter and wholesome taste resonating with my tastebuds.

I'm usually averse to savoury food in the mornings. In fact, I'm that stereotypical boring person who is very much content with a Weetabix to kickstart my day.

That may all be about to change after sampling the Mawasim Shakshuka, which I am happy to admit is one of the greatest dishes I've ever tasted. It seems simple but it's all about the execution; slow-baked roma tomatoes, eggs, crumbled feta cheese and roasted onions

all encased in a thin pastry shrine. Simply divine.

Of course, any fusion of Arabic cuisine must contain bread, and we were offered a lip-smacking sample of three different types, one topped with Bahraini moajanat, mahyawa sauce and melted cheese, another with Lebanese halloumi cheese and zaatar, with the third Armenian safeha, minced beef and tahini sauce.

Finally, although our stomachs were crying for mercy, we were treated to the most exotically-decorated Croissant Olé, packed to the brim with smoked turkey, creamy spinach sauce, scrambled eggs and garden greens.

The menu designed by Chef Maher combines all the insight he has gained on his travels. His culinary journey has taken him across Europe, meandering into the lap of royal experience at the Al Baraka Palace, Jordan and eventually making way to other Middle Eastern countries in managerial and executive chef roles.

I love coming to this market as its quiet and cool. I used to go to the one in Budaiya every Saturday but its only Saturday morning and if you miss it then you have to wait a week. I love that this market is a permanent fixture and has longer timings."

Shopper Hanan Mohammed, 35, loves that the market isn't far from her home in Isa Town and makes the short trek a few times-a-month with her family and friends to stock up on vegetables and fruits.

She said: "The prices at the market are pretty good and I get a lot of great vegetables for salads. I love that this market is indoor, air conditioned and looks chic too. It's more elegant and spacious."

The market also includes booths boasting handicrafts such as Um Mohammed Sefafa's basket weaving area. According to her friend Kadhem Ali, who handles her stall when she is unavailable, Um Mohammed has been weaving baskets, carpets, bags and other items for years. She launched the stall around five months ago.

He said: "Sometimes she makes the goods from home and other times she is weaving here. Her booth has attracted visitors interested in old style chicken cages, bread baskets, fans, picnic baskets, table tops and more." Prices for her items start from BD1.

After a day of shopping, customers can still delight in a traditional breakfast, which is a Farmers Market staple every Saturday, or from a selection of burgers and croissants.

Instead of picnicking on the grass, people can feast in a dedicated area featuring benches and tables with a friendly janitorial team waiting on the side-lines to keep the place in tip-top shape.

Chef Manal Al Abbassi's Fatima Gül Café dishes out delicious breakfast treats such as Turkish-style eggs, tikka roub sajj and halloumi and zaatar sandwich made fresh every day. The 39-year-old mother-of-three who lives in Janabiyah, said: "I have been running my Fatima Gül Café and Restaurant for the past five years in Janabiyah and I opened the café at this market four months ago. I only serve breakfasts with a dish of the day for lunch from time to time such as madrouba (beaten rice) and warak enab (vine leaves). Some days I receive a lot of hungry customers and some days it's still quiet as not many people know about this place yet. However, I did notice that our visitors are a mix of locals and expatriates.

"I love cooking here especially as I can pick up any vegetable I want from the market. I can come up with a dish on the spot or let the vegetables on sale guide me. This market is a great concept."

After breakfast, cool down with some Japanese ice cream from the Kane Mochi stall featuring coloured egg-shaped scoops.

According to its sales executive Cherelyn Torrequemada, it's gluten free ice cream covered in sticky rice with no added food preservatives.

The market is open to the public every day, except on Sunday, from 8am to 3pm.







dorsal fin on tide will always elicit the right amount of fear, especially when that fin belongs to a prehistoric fish coming in at 25 metres long.

The Meg, story-wise, is by no means difficult to discern, and neither is our protagonist's psyche. Jonas Taylor (Jason Statham) is a deep-diving Byronic hero. Following his navigation through freezing Asian waters is easy enough, but the very reason that gets him to revisit his haunting past – a female reason – does not show up again until the end of the film, making her slightly irrelevant. It seems strange that someone who could kick-start the plot by luring Jonas back into the ocean within the first fifteen minutes does not have a more impactful role.

On a similar note, throughout the course of the movie, Jonas' relationships are not thoroughly explored. Virtually all character connections to the main man translate onscreen as cursory, taking away the overall dynamic and sentiment of the film. Those relationships which are delineated, are done so fleetingly. All in all, this isn't the worst flaw in

the movie; it just means that Jonas, as a character, offers more in terms of physicality than he does emotionally.

Relatedly, albeit impressive, Statham's stunts are highly impractical. So much so, the term 'too lucky' comes to mind. This is a case of keeping the protagonist alive for the sake of the movie, and not because Jonas is a good enough swimmer to escape the jaws of death one too many times. The general pan out of perfectly-timed explosions and characters who should have unquestionably been chomped in half but weren't, is vaguely irritating.

As I have found to be a recurring theme with action-packed films, because the main objective is the action itself, the inclusion of humour never meets standards. *The Meg* is not a comedy, so I did not enter the cinema with the anticipation I would be doubling over in laughter. But, the comedic prospect — or lack thereof—that does make an appearance is flat and awkward to watch at times. The funniest characters are DJ (Page Kennedy) with his over-the-top sarcastic commentary, and eight-year-old Meiying (Shuya Sophia Cai), but even that's stretching it.

The film should be, however, praised for its excellent cinematography. The combination of both underwater and aerial scenes is expertly directed. You feel as though you are there, with Statham and his team, in the middle of the ocean. Surprisingly, there aren't half as many gory bloody scenes as you might expect from a shark movie.

With that said, the shark itself is quite intimidating to watch, a magnificent monster CGI creation. The comparison of the creature to existing animals such as humpback whales gives the film a scientific perspective, instilling a nuance of reality. There are points where you believe the creature might actually be real, until some believability-stretching sequence occurs to sink teeth into that theory.

The Meg incorporates an equally dispersed sense of thrill and suspense. Fast and fierce, this is a must-see for shark lovers and horror fanatics, but those looking for a bit of substance might be disappointed.

Two mighty Mercs

ESPITE the natural inclination to stay indoors during Bahrain's blast of summer heat, it's actually the best time to get out and about .. as long as you have a fine piece of machinery around you with powerful air conditioning.

Luckily for me, I had two of them, in the form of the Mercedes-Benz GLC250 and the GLC43 AMG Coupe

As mentioned, test drives are great in summer. A large slice of the population has gone away on holiday, while those remaining in the kingdom shelter in their homes or offices from the heat. That means one thing .. quieter roads and longer stretches of tarmac to put two beautiful beasts through their paces!

First up was the GLC43 with its rather distinctive shape. It features a sloping roofline, curving more sharply at the back for what would be the classic coupe shape were it not for the presence of rear doors and the fact that you're looking up to that roofline, not down

The involvement of Merc's sporting AMG division brings a twin-turbo V6 petrol engine, 367BHP, a ninespeed automatic transmission and rear-biased all-wheel drive

There's also an air suspension set-up that's intended to keep the car level at all times, plus some shapely bodywork, upgraded brakes and a high level of equipment in the cabin.

In summary, it makes this car an absolute pleasure to drive. Whether or not you like the looks, you'll

appreciate the craftsmanship, the materials, the comfort, and the intuitive layout of switches and controls. Yes, that includes the famous Mercedes 'UFO spaceship' touch controls for the centre

stack!

There's nothing quite like slipping into a Merc with its rather peculiar setup. Plug the seatbelt in, feel the tensioner tighten around your chest. Engage 'Drive' with the steering columnmounted stalk and you'll like the smooth, easy progress the GLC makes, the nicely weighted steering and the comfortable ride.

Chugging along on the highway is such a smooth experience, especially complemented by the highquality audio from the stereo speakers. Most importantly. it's also a real blast to put your foot to the floor and accelerate hard, overtaking pretty much anything on four wheels you're likely to come across

However, one thing I did notice is that it doesn't react too well to deviations in the road. It's a tall and heavy car on big wheels and chunky tyres, and it wants to wobble Whether you're in Eco, Comfort, Sport or Sport Plus mode, and whether you're driving in a straight line, over bumps, through bends - it has a much stronger affinity with jelly than you'd want in a luxury car

That quibble aside, there's no shortage of finely crafted hardware, as ever with Mercs. The engine is a brilliant combination of hardcharging and flexible, while the whole package feels like it's built to last. It comes

with very good infotainment and safety electronics packages, too

Finally, space is readily available too whether there's tall adults in the front or rear, and the boot had room for photographer Honey Sharma's various tripods, cameras and other equipment

Just a few days later. I was given the GLC250, a very similar model with a few differences.

Now, if I've got my research right, the GLC-Class is the successor to the GLK and the result of Mercedes-Benz wanting a good share of the premium mid-size SUV pie. The GLC-Class is a fairly new one, starting life as a 2016 model. and it adopts the 'G' moniker from 'Geländewagen' (or off-road vehicle) and 'L' from 'Luxus' (or luxury).

The 'C' denotes its sizing, which is equivalent to the C-Class

The 250 definitely feels like the 'lite' version of the AMG, which of course it is in a way, but that isn't necessarily a bad thing. In fact, where it loses out in the power department (a twolitre, four-cylinder, 211BHP petrol engine), it more than makes up for in comfort.

I actually found myself sinking deeper into the seats in the 250 and there was minimal, if any, of the wobble found in the 43 even when going over some of Bahrain's most treacherous potholes or when I took the car over some wasteland to check its off-roading capabilities.

It's extremely easy to drive for an SUV, with little noise intrusion into the cabin and good visibility all around.

Just like the 43, the 250 comes with Dynamic Select modes which offer you the

option to pick between Eco, Comfort, Sport, Sport+ and Individual settings from the

toggle next to the spaceship on the centre console. In Eco mode, the drive feels relaxed with unshifts coming early. Sport mode naturally turns up the heat with more aggressive revs and gets you going quickly. Individual mode lets you customise the engine and steering response as well as air-con fan speed and auto stop/start.

In both vehicles, I particularly liked the Active Parking Assist with Parktronic This feature helps you park and un-park the GLC with the help of sensors. All you need to do is work the gears, throttle and brake pedals; the vehicle will steer itself in and/or out. This feature is aided by the 360-degree view camera which gives a bird's eye view of your surroundings.

The rest of the touchscreen options are easy to navigate and use, both on the centre console and on the dashboard display. The only issue I had was connecting my phone to

Bluetooth, a process which seems overly complicated, requiring too many clicks and then being finicky even when it does work. I'd love Mercedes to refine their connectivity options in their next iteration of models.

Overall, both of the GLC cars were fun to drive and come highly recommended. Which one to go for is entirely up to you to decide, whether that be based on budget or personal preference. If it's power and swagger you're after, then the GLC43 AMG is the way to go. If it's comfort and grace, then the GLC is your port of call

Stroll comes to the rescue

HE Force India Formula One team will come out of administration after a rescue deal involving a consortium of investors led by Canadian billionaire Lawrence Stroll, administrators and management have revealed.

They said creditors would be paid in full and all 405 jobs at the Silverstonebased team, which was coowned by embattled Indian businessman Vijay Mallya and finished fourth last year, were safe. Stroll is the father of

Williams driver Lance.
Apart from Stroll, the
investors were named as
Canadian entrepreneur
Andre Desmarais, Jonathan
Dudman, John Idol, telecoms
investor John McCaw Jr,
Michael de Picciotto and
Stroll's business partner Silas

"This outcome secures the future of the Force India team in Formula One and will allow our team of racers to compete to our full potential," said the team's chief operating officer Otmar Szafnauer.

Chou.

"I am delighted that we have the support of a consortium of investors who believe in us as a team and who see the considerable business potential that Force India has within F1 now and in the future."

Force India's driver lineup is Mexican Sergio Perez and Mercedes-backed Frenchman Esteban Ocon but Stroll, 19, now looks likely to move from Williams next season given his father's involvement.

Joint administrator Geoff Rowley said funding to support the team would be made available immediately with "significantly more" once the company emerged from administration.

He expected that to be within two to three weeks, with the team set to compete at the next race at Spa-Francorchamps in Belgium on August 26.

Rowley said: "It is rare that a company can be rescued and returned to a position of solvency.

"The quality of the various interested parties has been impressive and required careful consideration as the administration has progressed.

"Having followed a robust process, in the end we were left with a highly-credible offer to save the company and restore solvency."

The team went into administration at the end of last month, with Perez triggering the process.

The Mexican had said he was owed more than \$4 million as part of sponsorship deals brought to the team, while engine provider Mercedes was due some 13 million euros. Leading sponsor BWT was also involved.

Force India's problems have been well-documented, with Mallya fighting an

attempt by India to extradite him from Britain to face charges of fraud, which he denies.

A group of Indian banks are seeking to recover more than \$1 billion of loans granted to his defunct Kingfisher Airlines.

Mallya has decried a 'political witchhunt' and has said he is seeking to sell assets worth about 139 billion rupees (\$2.03 billion) to repay creditors.

He was offered the role of the club teaching professional at the RGC in 2015 before stepping into his BGA role earlier this year. Now, he trains his adult charges from as early as 7am in the morning, before coaching the juniors throughout the afternoon before the seniors return in the evening.

"It's a hectic life, but it's extremely rewarding," he added.

Perez also wants to dispel some of the misconceptions

about the sport, such as the long-standing belief that you have to be a member to play at the RGC or spend vast amounts of money on equipment.

He explained: "It simply isn't true; in Bahrain, golf is accessible to everyone and the RGC's doors are always open, as is the wonderful Awali Golf Club. I would love to see more Bahraini people playing golf, especially kids.

"I'd hate to think that these myths are the things stopping kids from playing golf, or the cause of their parents dissuading them. Yes, golf isn't as cheap as buying a football and that's it, but you don't need the very best equipment or even a full set of clubs if you're a junior just wanting to learn.

"So please, if you have any interest, look at joining a club or one of our programmes and see how you get on. To reach the highest level, the standards are tough and you have to be serious, but it's the most rewarding sport in the world in my opinion."

Tiger is on the prowl again

on the edge of the cup, its logo peeking into the hole for what felt like forever.

Back in the day, that ball dropped for Tiger Woods. On Sunday, it wouldn't

Yes, Woods finished second by two strokes to Brooks Koepka at the PGA Championship to extend his drought without a major for at least eight more months. But after the scrambling, club-slamming, fist-pumping, electrifying show he put on over a round of six-under 64 - his best closing round at a major — who can argue that golf isn't more fun when Tiger's in the mix?

'There's nothing like it.' said Gary Woodland, who was in the twosome with the world's best-known player. "The energy in that place was unbelievable.

Even after the excruciating miss on the eleventh hole, Woods would not quit.

Shortly after, he had a 20foot putt on the 16th green that would have tied him with Koepka, who was two holes behind but may as well have been playing on another course compared to the frenzy in front of him.

That putt slid just past And Woods' last chance to apply real pressure vanished when he pushed his tee shot on the par-five 17th right of the creek running along the right side of the hole. Woods slammed the head of his driver to the ground, then swung it violently in frustration. He scrambled to make par, but by the time he reached the 18th fairway, he was three back from Koepka, who birdied 15 and 16 behind him.

On the 18th, Woods offered one final flourish. He drained his longest putt of the tournament, a 19-footer putt for birdie, and pumped his fist to celebrate.

Back in the day, that fist pump on the 18th green would've been to celebrate a win

On this day, he was celebrating the grind - and the fact that he simply would

"I played hard," he said after finishing the tournament at 14-under 266. "A bit of a struggle with my game today, but I hung in there."

In many ways, this felt like old times for the 42-yearold, he of the multiple back surgeries who couldn't swing a club 11 months ago, but has now contended on the

back nine in consecutive majors, only to come up short, more agonisingly so this time than at Carnoustie three weeks ago.

However, although the victory might not have quite been his, the fact that he came so close after genuinely fearing he would never play the sport again is phenomenal

That fact that he was still in contention after his first nine holes Sunday was a testament to the sort of resilience he can show, not only over the long haul, but over the ups-and-downs of a pressure-packed round.

He came out to the course and missed all seven fairways on the front nine. And yet, he scrambled. As the putts kept dropping, the roars got louder.

"The first real Tiger effect I've experienced, with that many people," said defending champion Justin Thomas, who played two groups ahead and finished tied for sixth.

Though he closes 2018 still without a major title since the 2008 US Open, it's hard, after a performance like this, to think the drought can last forever. His major finishes this year: 32nd at the Masters, cut in the US Open, tied for sixth at the Open and, now, second at the PGA

His ranking has jumped

from 656 to start the year to 26 heading out of Bellerive.

Woods has never been someone who was satisfied with second. But he said he hadn't felt this good at a tournament he didn't win in a long time.

"I had to kind of figure this out on my own and it's been really hard ... a lot harder than people think," he said. "I'm just very pleased at what I've done so far, going from where I've come from,

to now over the last year, it's been pretty cool.

During the media furore over Tiger, the actual winner has almost been forgotten. Heck, I'm guilty of it myself in this very article! But a word of congratulations must be offered to Koepka: winning your third Major in just over a year is no mean

What makes this win, which adds to his consecutive US Open

victories, all the more impressive is that the whole course was screaming and shouting for Tiger. Not only did Koepka have the pressure of being chased down by the greatest player to ever play the game, but he did it with an audience silently willing him to collapse. That takes nerves of steel, and there was little sign of the jitters. If he keeps this form, there are many more to come

UAN Manuel Fuentes Perez is hoping to drive the sport of golf forward in the kingdom by persuading young boys and girls to take up the game and shoot Bahrain back to the top of the regional leaderboards.

The former Royal Golf Club (RGC) teaching professional is now the Bahrain Golf Association (BGA) national team coach, in charge of more than 35 talented players across numerous teams including adults and juniors.

The 32-year-old, from Algeciras in Spain's famous Costa del Sol, believes that in the next three-to-five years Bahrain will return to the level of success it formally enjoyed and has taken significant steps to entice youngsters to play the game with clinics in malls and the offering of lessons.

He said: "We've started a junior programme as we really want to focus on getting kids, both male and female, playing this wonderful game. So if any youngsters from Bahrain are interested, they join a couple of times a week and learn the basics and techniques which will hopefully spur them on to take the game further.

"I'm delighted to be





working with the national team, and I can't wait to get us back to where we belong as soon as possible. We were the leaders in the sport across the GCC for a long time and have won the most tournaments in the region. With the talent we have now, I believe this is possible, but there are always more players to be found!"

Perez met the late, great Seve Ballesteros at a young age and also counts Sergio Garcia and Tiger Woods as his main influences. Although more interested in football and water sports in his early years, Perez' golf-mad family used to drag him round the course, and gradually he fell in love with the game himself.

He started playing properly at the age of 10 when he joined the junior tournaments in his local area and went on to become a four-time winner of the Andalusian Professional Golf Tour, the Spanish region of his birth.

He explained: "Like every golfer, I originally wanted to be a Tour Pro. That was the dream. However, it's very difficult to get there as you can imagine! I dedicated myself to competitions and won a couple of times, advancing to the European Tour qualifying rounds, but didn't quite make the cut.

"Luckily, I was always partially coaching while playing, both students and other pros. I decided pretty quickly that I wanted to carry on with this full time."

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
