COMMUNITY REPORT

HAT started as a personal Instagram account showcasing the life of Birthe van der Heijden in Bahrain, flourished into a community initiative in which she and bighearted individuals cook up meals for migrant workers as well as spread the message of unity through kindness.

OneHeartBahrain was launched in September of last year and has already garnered 165 members all working on the same vision — "to help people recognise that we are One World, One People and One Bahrain Community."

The Dutch mother-of-three, who is a social strategist and teacher in meditation practice, said: "Goodwill is the simple mechanism by which we can achieve this state of oneness as it is the glue that unites people into right relationships promoting greater peace, harmony and potential value within our society."

Birthe moved to the kingdom with her husband Simon Peters, director Middle East in Education Services, five-and-a-half years ago along with her children Darcey, 14, Caitlin, 12 and Sacha, 10, who study at St Christopher's School. She immediately fell in love with the island's "rich tapestry of

nationalities".

"I wanted to do something to support this diversity," explained Birthe.

"Everything I was doing just reflected my desire to promote oneness amongst people. I started to incorporate some posts about food charity, purely as a demonstration of our human connection with the migrant workers.

"I was also offering group meditation as a form of community service. Afterwards, I started to focus the group meditation specifically on World Goodwill. Then the three components came together — social media awareness

about having one Bahrain community, a World Goodwill Meditation Group and the Food Initiative."

They first started buying restaurant meals and distributing them to the workers but then felt they could create deeper and more meaningful experiences of doing good if they created the

meals themselves.

Birthe teamed up with Monica Fernandes, who is originally from Goa, to be her right-hand woman and head chef of their food initiative.

Now, they produce a weekly batch of meals, ranging from 50 to 80 meals from a nonindustrial kitchen.

Stronger together

BAHRAIN. founded by Birthe van der Heijden, aims to unite the kingdom through acts of kindness from preparing meals for migrant workers to staging meditations to inspire like-minded individuals.

The community driven Instagram account started on Birthe's vision of spreading awareness about the beauty of diversity and how we are all stronger together. She began to post her charitable food endeavours as well as hosting group meditations geared towards World Goodwill.

World Goodwill is an organisation founded in 1932 to apply the teachings of former Theosophist Alice A Bailey, specifically to improve human relations in the world. The energy of goodwill is potentially a powerful force for social change. The organisation supports the work of the United Nations and the people of goodwill are those who think and act with a measure of loving understanding and of concern for the well-being of all

Birthe, who is a firm believer in World Goodwill, said: "We are stronger when we come together as one. We are all part of one global system and Bahrain has its own beautiful and diverse ecosystem made up of many nationalities

"When we embrace this diversity whilst recognising and nurturing our shared humanity, it creates a more powerful nation, as the whole is always greater than the sum of its parts. Together everyone achieves more

"My meditation group grew into more of a community service shortly after I started offering the Goodwill







Meditations in which I was explaining to people about the general merits of doing service. To give people this experience, I started inviting them to join the food drives "The food effort then

evolved. In the last two months, we have started cooking our own meals to offer both our volunteers a deeper and more meaningful experience of community service. Monica Fernandes who has worked with us since we first came to Bahrain, loves to cook and as such is the natural choice to be in charge of the meal production. She has prior experience in catering and makes the most wonderful Indian food."

The group of volunteers is

made up of Bahrainis, British, Australian, Indian, Swedish, Irish Russian Dutch South African, Canadian, Italian, German and Bangladeshi. Members from the multinational team prepare food together in Birthe's kitchen in Saar.

She said: "We are very lucky to have a large 'island' in the centre of the kitchen which allows us to work well as a group, especially when it comes to parcelling up. We have bought special oversized cooking tools to accommodate the large quantities of food, but given the size of the pans and the restricted size of a 'privateuse' cooker, we are still limited how fast and how much we can cook

"We generally operate on a five mile radius around Saar to ensure the food is nice and warm when it reaches the workers. But sometimes a volunteer may request a different site with people that they wish to serve and whilst we are still small, we are able to accommodate this.

Her mediation sessions are also held every Wednesday at noon from her house. She said: "I feel meditation is more meaningful when we use it to do good and expand our minds and hearts to embrace the whole human race as one great big family. We have found that the people who do these meditations become more influenced by this more inclusive way of thinking and start to

incorporate goodwill practices into their daily routines and

work life. We furthermore plan to offer the meditation every Saturday at noon and are looking for a good location where there may be relevant interest - if anyone wishes to host then please get in touch." All Goodwill Meditations are free of charge.

The group has kept the volunteering involvement fairly small thus far but there will come a point when they need to expand their operations.

"We have had both children and adults helping in the kitchen and with the distribution of the meals. added Birthe. "The children are the future and they are

naturally very caring and altruistic and as such we wish to encourage them to maintain that selfless outlook as they mature.

"I like to involve my children in our work so that they develop certain life skills as well as gain an understanding of what's involved in doing 'service' from the ground up. They usually help to prepare the food and deliver to the workers and on a personal wellbeing level, practicing selflessness helps to expand their minds and hearts, teaches them humility and kindness?

St Christopher's School student Tabitha Moore, 12, loves the food initiative. She said: "It is good to give food because the workers often have families to support in their home country and they don't always have much money to spend on themselves. So when we give them a healthy meal it helps.

The group's greater vision is to create a goodwill ecosystem in Bahrain that supports the development of human capital and as such the economic potential of the nation. "We hope to collaborate with the bright young minds of the academic community to develop an AI technology platform for this purpose, the full potential of which could be explored by means of an entrepreneurial academic incubator," she explained. "This is something we are investigating at present and we would love to hear from interested parties who wish to contribute to the development of a Goodwill Shareconomy in Bahrain.'

HE ninth edition of the Bahrain For All festival was held at Bahrain Bay, attracting more than 55,000 visitors and bringing different communities together to highlight inclusivity and harmony in diversity.

The two-day festival, held under the theme "Leaving Nobody Behind", showcased traditional dance and stage performances and 150 market stalls highlighting cultural items, handmade goods, food and products for sale from various communities and societies on the island including the Regional Institute of Autism (RIA) and the Friendship Society for the Blind.

Bahrain for all founder and organiser Nivedita Dhadphale said: "Bahrain has a very long history of tolerance and unity in its diversity so really this is about promoting inclusivity and endorsing everything that Bahrain stands for.

"We are grateful to Capital Governor Shaikh Hisham bin Abdulrahman Al Khalifa, as well as the Capital Governorate team and the volunteers who have worked with us to make this event happen. Having the event at Bahrain Bay was fantastic - not only was the stage bigger and the view much more scenic, this presented the modern face of Bahrain and we are glad to be part of it."

The popular Bahraini Police Band, celebrating 100 years of Bahrain Police, also performed at the event, along with several local emcees and musicians.

The event, which was inaugurated by Shaikh Hisham, included stalls exhibiting handicrafts from various countries, including Philippines, Thailand. Ethiopia, India and more.

Thai Ambassador to Bahrain, Thanis Na Songkhla said: "It has been a very successful couple of days. We got a lot





Sarva Velamuri, one of the volunteers at the event, added: "The Sensory Room provided a calm space for people with special needs to relax and offered a calming environment to anyone who may

have felt overwhelmed in unfamiliar surroundings. That way everyone could enjoy the festival which can be overwhelming to those who are hypersensitive to sensory inputs."

The festival drew families from across the island, with a special maze, children's stage and activities set up for the little ones. Mohsin Akbar, who was there with his wife Ahsan and their two children, said: "My kids enjoyed all the different activities and my wife and I enjoyed the view. This is the first time we came to the

Gualnetti securing third and Christian Agulto winning fourth place.




Each of the four chefs picked a mystery black box, each with a different protein that would be the focus of their entrée or piatto. The contestants were also required to prepare an antipasto starter.

The semi-finals were held on February 2 and 4 with 12 participants taking part in a taste-and-make challenge. They were required to recreate one of Italia Cucina executive Chef Jagath Jayasekara's dishes from taste alone.

The final was split into two rounds – the 30-minute appetiser round and the 45-minute main course round, with each round being judged separately.

To start, contestants were given 10 minutes to pick their choice of fresh ingredients and Italian spices from a spread set up by executive Chef Jagath.

They then headed to the kitchen to prepare their starters, while a kitchen camera gave the audience an inside perspective of the culinary experience.

The four-heat competition was launched last month, with support from sponsors like the Bahrain Family Leisure Company and Gulf Hotel Bahrain. Competitors of every nationality participated, with some like Laura driving in from Saudi Arabia to cook up a



Where East meets West



HERE was a time when Tala Bashmi, former captain of the vibrant Venus football team, was scoring on the pitch and now the talented Bahraini chef is scoring high marks in her kitchen at Gulf Hotel Bahrain's Fusions restaurant.

The 31-year-old, who competed in the popular reality Top Chef Middle East (TV cooking series), is heading the signature rooftop restaurant, Fusions by Tala, at the five-star luxury property and is doing so flawlessly from what I observed at her pre-launch dinner service event earlier in

the week. The culinary alchemist has transformed traditional Middle Eastern cuisine into contemporary works of art that are whimsical. sensory and nostalgic.

Her creativity knows no bounds as she brought smiles to the faces of lucky first-time tasters during the event that were invited to sample her dishes.

Justin Tomy, Fusions by Tala restaurant manager who shared that the fine dining section can accommodate 45 patrons comfortably, was eager to hear the feedback from the invited

Justin was spot-on as we watched through the glasswalled partitions as Tala buzzed around in her kitchen with her culinary team, whisking, stirring and plating her dishes to be adored by her

I was already impressed by her educational background and skills so I couldn't wait to see what surprises she had in store in her signature five course tasting menu.

Now, lets discuss her artistic craft - her food. I was seated with photographer Honey Sharma and marketing

manager Jalal Muradi. Tala weaved past tables meeting her guests and getting them ready for the flavourful journey to come. The amuse bouche was a variety of cauliflowers and romanesco from Bahrain all from the farmers market on top of a ceralic puree, capers and a couple of foie gras which Tala described as a little explosion of really nice local produce.

She started us off fresh!

For the first course, we had sous vide salmon with cucumber and fennel with mehvawa salt. Mehyawa is an Iranian cuisine tangy sauce made out of fermented fish. It is an acquired taste that I personally am not a fan of as it's usually overpowering. Not in this case though. This salmon was everything! I could have had two more of those salmon dishes and called it a night. It was refreshing, summery and melted like butter.

The next course was the Cheeba which is Bahraini prawn dumplings stuffed with raisins and onions in a tamarind sauce. It was divine. A coconut sorbet with cured egg yolk appeared to cleanse our palette which was another one of my favourites My main was delish. I opted for seafood while Ialal chose the meaty bamia dish that was tender and juicy. My bouillabaisse curry, featuring octopus, clams and seasonal seafood, was a scrumptious and savoury under-the-sea medley that made me wiggle in my seat. It was flavourful

to the last bite.

The evening ended with a fudgy chocolate sponge cake delight with pistachio ganache and salted whey caramel sauce dripped all over the cake. It was the perfect dessert to end the flavourful food voyage. Tala took us on a tantalising trip of the senses. I can't wait for her outdoor terrace to open up as well.







Birds of a HERE are very feathei few opinions that achieve

consensus in the comic book community -Suicide Squad being an abomination is one of them.

With a ridiculous amount of hype around the making of the movie as well as the mayor of melodrama Jared Leto involved, Suicide Squad sullied the name of DC comics, at least until the recent chain of excellent movies

from the DC extended universe

Building on the success of Wonder Woman Birds of Prey: And the Fantabulous Emancipation of One Harley Quinn tells a story that is both entertaining and emotionally

satisfying to those who have watched Batman's most famous supervillain abuse his girlfriend and biggest fan through the years.

The movie starts off with a cartoon-animated retelling of Harley Quinn (Margot Robbie)'s childhood and encounter with the Joker, all the way up to her final breakup with the killer clown. This is the first time we are shown that despite most of her depictions, she really has built herself up from nothing

with the Joker being her fatal flaw...much like Suicide Sauad the movie. Alright, that's enough Jared jabs.

Right after the life recap, Harley goes on a break-up party spree involving the usual hallmarks of an 'uncoupling'

including a new haircut. aggravated assault and a hyena named after her ex's broody bat-crazy soul mate.

And she decides to finally and very publicly update her relationship status by blowing up Ace Chemicals, the site of her transformation into The Clown Prince of Crime's princess

As all the people she irked over the years are finally free to kill Harley, we celebrate her emancipation by diving into four interlocked stories as narrated by the former Miss Joker.

We meet our villain Roman Sionis (played by the ever enigmatic Ewan McGregor), a ruthless crime lord, who wants to take over the city. Yes, very original. Jokes

aside, and trust me. there's so many terrible jokes by Roman that I began to wonder if he was auditioning for the role of Mr Harley Ouinn. Ewan always gives one of those performances you can never take your eyes off, no matter if he is the hero or villain. And

his bromance with Victor Zsasz (Chris Messina), one of the most sadistic and psychopathic killers in the DC universe, is hilarious yet nuanced.

We are also introduced to Renee Montoya (Rosie Perez), the stereotypical cop who steals evidence, pursues the truth and kicks butt for breakfast. Black Canary. i.e. Dinah Lance (Jurnee Smollett-Bell) gives a memorable voice to our crew, which is rounded

off with Cassandra Cain (Ella Jay Basco) and Huntress i.e. Helena Bertinelli (Marv Elizabeth Winstead).

The movie is predictable in some ways, but a reimagining of the comic book universe in many more ways. While some parts are a slow burn, the action is much better paced and extremely satisfying to watch, with fantastically choreographed and entertaining yet gruesome fights

Yes, there were plot holes. Yes, it sometimes seemed like a smoothie of moments kidnapped from the Marvel universe. And yes, character traits often seemed incongruent or altogether missing when compared to the comic books.

But it had surprisingly complex characters, beautiful fight sequences and a car chase with roller skates. It was fun, interesting and had just the right amount (none) of Jared for any Joker-related movie. For that last bit alone, it earns its four popcorns



HE kingdom is already gearing up for Dakar Rally 2021 in Saudi Arabia and will be competing with its own team courtesy of a joint venture between Bahrain Mumtalakat Holding Company and Prodrive International.

Two rally cars will be manufactured and operated annually by Prodrive International who will also produce other customer cars and offer a range of

performance parts and body

kits as accessories for clients. The multi-stage annual race, which was first established in 1978, would normally begin in Paris, France and end in Dakar, Senegal, covering approximately 10,000sqm over a period of about 16 days

Between 2009 and 2019, the race was relocated to South America and opened in Saudi Arabia for the first time this year. Rally cars race one at a time, against the clock, across multiple stages of the intense off-road terrain.

Gronk, as he was known, also had a keen taste for a party during his career, including hiring a cruise liner known as the Gronk party ship that was used for a four-day party and included more than 12 lounges and other recreational

The reason I am looking to these examples of athletes who have enjoyed themselves throughout their career is to highlight that it is possible to reach your potential within sport without cutting back on your lifestyle.

I also wanted to emphasise how easily sports fans can forgive you for this so long as you still produce the goods. Something Neymar is currently struggling with at PSG.

Those close to Neymar came out and told the world that his decision to leave Barcelona in 2017 was a footballing one. He was perceived to be in the shadow of Lionel Messi and was ready to step out of that to assert himself as the best player in world football. That

hasn't quite gone to plan. In the year he joined the Parisian giants, he came third overall in the Ballon D'or standings, in his second year he came 12th and last year he did not even make the cut for the top 30 whilst two of his teammates, Kylian Mbappe and Marquinhos, came sixth and 28th respectively.

If that genuinely was the reason that Neymar made the

move, it has to be said that he is well off getting close to achieving his goal. The reason that has been suggested for this is Neymar's own lavish lifestyle. Last week, the media hammered him again.

He rented out a high-end nightclub and invited 400 people all to celebrate his birthday just days before PSG's next fixture. In fact, Neymar has been conveniently injured on his birthday all three seasons he has been in Paris and whilst that may be nothing more than unfortunate coincidence, last year he was hobbling around on crutches. It doesn't help the narrative.

As I have mentioned, however, it is still perfectly possible to indulge in off-field activities and still be able to produce on it. Neymar himself hasn't just started to become a flamboyant figure, he was still this way when partnering with Lionel Messi and Luis Suarez at Barcelona and managed to be a part of the most feared attacking trio at that time.

For me, the problem is

deeper than that and more reflective of PSG and the French "Ligue 1" as a whole. They have fueled Neymar's celebrity and stardom. He is almost untouchable within the ranks and is the star of the show no matter where he goes or how well he plays in France

Just days before his birthday, Neymar played against Montpellier in a league game and received the ball with three defenders around him. He attempted to flick the ball over the heads of the defenders and failed. The referee then came over to him to advise Neymar that he could potentially incite retaliation from his opponents if he continued to try and humiliate them.

Neymar threw his toys out of the pram at the suggestion he should be careful in any way and was subsequently booked for his reaction.

At 28, there is still time for Neymar to perform as one of the best players on the highest stage but he has to change his mind set on what is important on the pitch.

Messi and Ronaldo are not just beautiful to watch but they are ruthless in their performances. Neymar's dancing on and off the field might see him boogie into obscurity with a new generation of superstars coming up behind him not least his own teammate Mbappe. The boy from Brazil might just have to leave the Parisians to get back to where he needs to be.
