COTTISH-**BAHRAINI** thespian Ghazi Al Ruffai's latest thriller film 28 Years Later is entertaining audiences worldwide, shining a bright spotlight on the kingdom's cinematic talent.

The 25-year-old, who attended St Christopher's School, is also set to star in the sequel 28 Years Later: The Bone Temple, which will release in January next year.

28 Years Later is the third instalment in the series, following 28 Days Later (2002) and 28 Weeks Later (2007), and explores the second outbreak of the 'Rage'

There are plans for a fifth film 28 Years Later Part 3.

A group of survivors from the first outbreak live on a small island. When a member of the group leaves the island on a mission into the mainland, he discovers a mutation that has spread to not only the infected, but other survivors as well.

"Filming 28 Years Later was simply wild! Everything was very tight-lipped during the audition process, so I never knew I'd be playing a key role," said the former Riffa resident who currently lives in London and brings 'Jimmy Snake' alive on the big screen.

During the initial outbreak of the virus, Jimmy (played by a different child actor) flees from his house after his family gets infected. While taking shelter at a local church, he finds his father, a local vicar, who gives him a necklace and urges him to escape, succumbing to the virus in the process.

"I make my first appearance at the end of the first film as part of the cliff-hanger, and the lead-up was intense. We had weeks of stunt training, which consisted of fight choreography, acrobatics and weaponry," he added.

Elaborating on his experience filming, the creative talent who lived in Bahrain for 19 years before moving to the UK said: "The whole thing was so surreal; I still pinch myself about it. Above all, to be directed by Danny Boyle, a true legend

On top of that, my fellow Jimmies and I truly became a family. We all just clicked instantly that it felt like we had known each other for years."

Ghazi has always had the 'acting bug' in him and was an 'expressive' child growing up, forcing his siblings to join him and put on shows for their parents. However, he did not think it could happen. That changed during his years studying at St Christopher's School.

"At St Christopher's, I was able to explore drama in an academic setting. The drama department was incredibly supportive, and that encouragement helped me take acting a bit more seriously," he said.

However, a real turning point came when Ghazi joined the Makan School of Speech and Drama and met its founder

and acting instructor Rugaya Aamer, who helped him hone his craft and find his voice as an actor. "I credit so much of my growth and success to her," he noted.

The actor, who visits regularly, was in Bahrain in January this year when he visited St Christopher's and gave a talk to Year 12 and 13 drama and acting students, sharing his journey and offering tips.

After graduating school, Ghazi moved to the UK in 2018 to pursue acting professionally and trained at the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama and the Guildford School of Acting. Towards the end of his studies at Guildford, he landed an agent and it has been 'go go go' ever since.

His past projects include Layla (2024), and the docudrama Lockerbie: A Search for Truth (2025), in which he portrayed Khaled Megrahi.

In addition to his screen work, Ghazi is a prominent content creator on social media, where his comedic and character-driven videos have built a dedicated following of more than 200,000. He is passionate about using his platform to challenge stereotypes and spotlight under-represented voices in the industry.

# Enter the world of fantasy





AHRAINI author Bader AlSadeqi's new titles, The Wayfall Kidnapping and His Heroic Worth, are set to hit the shelves this month, transporting readers to a fantastic world of dwarves, elves, knights, princesses and more.

The 75-page *The Wayfall Kidnapping* is a villainous caper-crime fantasy novella – the creative talent's first attempt at the sub-genre.

"I wanted to try a story with more villain-centric characters," the 32-year-old told *GulfWeekly*, explaining his experience with the style.

"All the stories I write take place in the same fantasy world, but independent of each other, and while all have a focus on action and adventure, their characters are not necessarily all heroic. Writing a caper-crime novella added more fun and flexibility in my storytelling.

"The challenge was coming up with a more straightforward story while maintaining some fun and excitement, especially with the focus on villains as main characters. I felt this was something different, and I found the experience very enjoyable," he added.

A caper story is a type of crime fiction and unlike straight crime has elements of humour, adventure or unusual cleverness – the main character often exhibits comical idiosyncrasies and law enforcement individuals are typically incompetent.

Wayfall Kidnapping is set in the glittering city of Wayfall. The story explores a daring team of women, each with an unapologetic history involving crime,

who are brought together for a job that might catapult them to fame or to the darkness of death.

The novella is part of Bader's *Daedalusian Legends* series, which currently comprises seven titles, including the new books.

"Writing these fantasy fictions has been a journey of weaving intricate plots, crafting more or less morally complex characters, and balancing the thrills with the depth of world-building," said the IT-systems analyst and holder of a Bachelor's degree in Information

Technology and Security from NYIT.

"One of the greatest highlights has been watching the story evolve, seeing characters surprise me, twists unfold naturally, and the world take on a life of its own.

"The biggest challenge? Ensuring the mystery remains sharp while keeping the fantasy elements immersive and believable.

"I've been working on these stories for over a month or more, refining every detail to make the adventure as gripping as possible."

Blending action, adventure,



and other tropes of traditional heroic fantasy, sword and sorcery, *His Heroic Worth* is a 54-page short story and tells the tale of Prince Ronvid of Novidraken and Princess Philippa of Corniashire, who have long been betrothed – their union arranged to unite two neighbouring kingdoms.

As the day of their longawaited wedding draws near, the young couple temporarily escapes courtly life for a private retreat.

But their idyllic getaway turns into a disaster when a vicious wyvern descends from the skies, abducting Philippa, setting the stage for 'a crucible of devotion, valour and chivalry', one that will truly test Ronvid.

Bader has been passionate about fantasy and science fiction ever since he was a young boy, which inspired him to write stories of his own. His books are a testament to his 'wild imagination', which he dreams of sharing with others.





### A TOUCHING TALE OF TIMELESS LOVE

AGICAL realism novel *The Art* of *Vanishing* by Morgan Pager has hit the shelves.

The love story follows Claire, a gallery worker, who finds herself enamoured by an artwork of Jean, who is frozen in time by his painter father Henri Matisse.

Eventually Claire discovers she can step through the frame of Jean's painting and into a bygone era, resulting in the two falling in love.

"It is a magical love story about a museum employee and the man in a masterpiece hanging on the walls," Morgan said in a social media post.

"It's about time and art and the ways magic might surround us in our day-to-day lives, if we take the time to stop and see it," she added.

This is the author's debut novel. Prior to this, the bookworm launched an online platform for her to share what she is reading and her life in New York City.

Morgan also pursued a career in theatrical producing, and eventually joined a book publishing company where she handles marketing and the company's social media platforms.



### CREATING SAFE SPACES

MERICAN pop singer Kesha's new album *Period* releases tomorrow, July 4.

This is the singer's first independent album-release through her label Kesha Records since ending her legal battle with former collaborator and producer Dr Luke, followed by her departure from his label Kemosabe Records in 2023

It marked the end of a long chapter of her career where she was allegedly stuck in an 'unsafe and restricting environment', both mentally and artistically.

In an interview, Kesha said that with the new project she finally felt free – both creatively and legally.

She added that her goal, while making the new music, was to create a safe space for people to feel embodied and liberated, signified through the first track titled *Freedom* as well as the release date on July 4, which marks the United States' Independence Day.

The singer's first independently released single off the album, *Joyride*, was also released

on last year's Independence Day.

"I'm really trying to embody freedom in every way possible. I'm trying to allow myself to feel what freedom feels like, because it's been almost 20 years (in the industry) for me," the 38-year-old explained.

"Freedom, by definition, is the power and the right to act and speak and think as you want to without any restraint. And it's terrifying for me to really embody full freedom, because it's the act of really embodying who you are to the fullest. And to really feel that, it starts

with safety. So, that's why creating safe spaces has been my number-one objective," she added.

Born Kesha Rose Sebert, the pop sensation was encouraged by her singer/ songwriter mother Patricia 'Pepe' Sebert to pursue singing after she noticed her daughter's talent.

The Grammy-nominated artist earned a near-perfect score on her SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) and was offered a scholarship to Barnard College.

However, she decided to pursue her musical career instead.

However, what should have been a weekend of reconnecting and celebration turns into a death trap when armed mercenaries crash the big day.



#### THREE BRITONS CAN WIN BUT PIASTRI HAS HIS OWN SCRIPT

HREE British winners have their sights on a home grand prix victory this weekend but Oscar Piastri could rain on that particular parade as Formula One returns to where the championship started 75 years ago.

Australia's championship leader can still count on plenty of support as a McLaren driver but much of the crowd, and certainly the 10,000 in Silverstone's sold-out 'Landostand', will be cheering more for British teammate Lando Norris.

Norris won Piastri's home grand prix in Melbourne in March, an added incentive for the Australian at Silverstone, and the pair are turning the season into a two-horse race as the campaign reaches the halfway point.

Piastri is chasing a sixth win in 12 races while Norris arrives from Austria on a high after dominating every practice session he took part in, taking pole by a huge margin and holding off his teammate to win.

The two are 15 points apart, with Red Bull's reigning four-times world champion Max Verstappen third overall but now a hefty 61 points off the lead after a first retirement of the season at his team's home track at Spielberg.

"My favourite weekend of the year," said Norris, who has yet to take back-to-back wins.

"It's already a special

circuit but to also have my family, friends, home fans and so many of the team there supporting us takes it to another level. I'll try to make sure I give the fans a wave as I drive past."

Piastri recalled he had fans chanting his name at Silverstone not so long ago.

"I am not sure I will get that again but they have always been very accepting of me. I race for a British team. I am expecting that there will be more Lando fans than there are for me but that's fair enough," he said.

If Norris's support is strong, then Ferrari's Lewis Hamilton will always be the big sentimental favourite.

The last two races have been won by British drivers – George Russell for Mercedes in Canada and then Norris last weekend. Could Hamilton make it three and send the crowd crazy?

The 40-year-old won with Mercedes last year for a record ninth time and taking that tally into double figures, in what will be his first home appearance in the Italian team's red colours, would be something else.

Ferrari are the only topfour team without a win this season, other than Hamilton's Shanghai sprint success, and the seven-times world champion has yet to stand on the podium for his new employers. He has also gone 13 races without a top-three finish, a career low.

On the plus side, Ferrari were second fastest in Austria with Charles Leclerc third and Hamilton fourth and a new floor seems to be doing what it was supposed to do.

Hamilton usually manages to produce something special at Silverstone, set to welcome a record half-million fans this time over the four days.

Last year he turned up after 52 races without a win and seized one of the most emotional triumphs of his extraordinary career.



Russell, on pole as Hamilton's teammate last year, also has a strong chance – particularly if temperatures cool – and will be eager to bounce back from a tough weekend in Austria. Italian rookie teammate Kimi Antonelli meanwhile carries over a three-place grid drop from Austria.

Britain's fourth driver, Oliver Bearman at Haas, will be targeting points while the same applies to British-born Thai Alex Albon at Williams.

### F1 BOSS EXPECTS UK RACE TO BE ON CALENDAR 'FOREVER

SILVERSTONE circuit could stay on the Formula One calendar forever with no real rival to host the British Grand Prix, the sport's chief executive Stefano Domenicali said ahead of this weekend's race.

The Italian told reporters he could not imagine a championship without Britain, home to seven of the 10 teams, but there was also no chance of the country having more than one race.

"I do believe that... Silverstone has the right characteristics to stay forever in the calendar," said Domenicali, who is set to visit Downing Street with some drivers and team bosses to meet Prime Minister Keir Starmer. "There's no other places where you can develop such a huge event in the UK. I don't see any other places, to be honest."

Silverstone hosted the first world championship race in 1950 and has a contract until 2034. Last year it hosted the biggest crowd of any event on the calendar with 480,000 spectators.

Miami and Austria's Red Bull Ring have the longest deals, both running to 2041, and Domenicali saw no reason why Silverstone could not join them although the circuit

management had yet to seek an extension.

The meeting at Downing Street is billed as an informal celebration of the 75th anniversary of the first F1 championship race at Silverstone, but it is also a chance to raise issues the sport wants

addressed.

Domenicali said he would highlight how much the "F1 ecosystem" contributes to Britain as the beating heart of a global sport, and the risk of losing that primacy due to restrictions on staff and movement. Formula One figures calculate the sport brings 12 billion pounds (\$16.48bn) annually to the UK economy with 6,000 people directly employed and a further 41,000 working in a supply chain of 4,500

companies.

The Italian said visa issues post-Brexit had affected the deployment of staff from race to race around Europe, while costly and time-consuming paperwork had complicated logistics and made it harder to draw up the race calendar.

"It is impossible to think in the short term that the teams will move out from the UK because of this limitation but the teams will organise themselves maybe in a different way," he warned. www.gulfweekly.com July 3-9, 2025


